

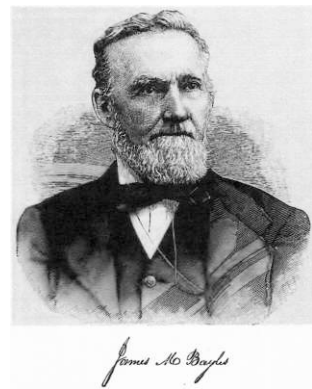
FOREVERMORE ON CEDAR HILL

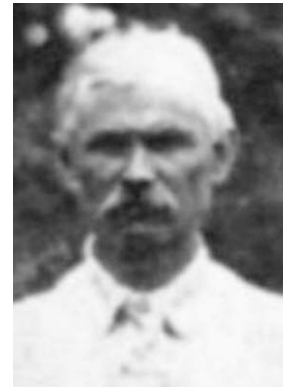

Doctor James E. Gidersleeve; (1826-1904) One of the earliest of Port Jefferson's Doctors



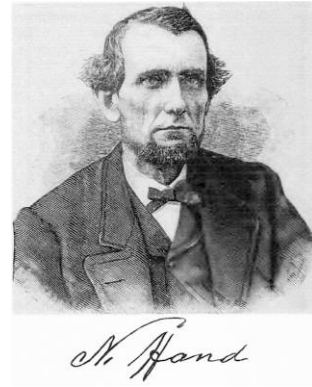

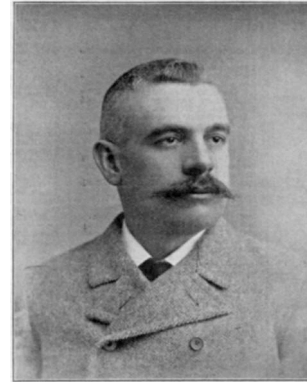

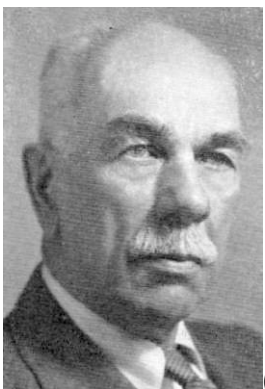

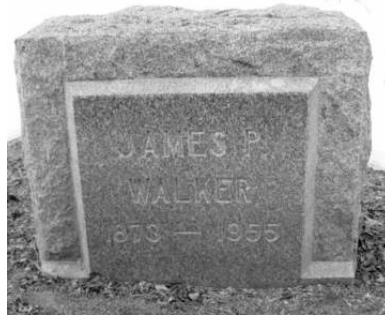

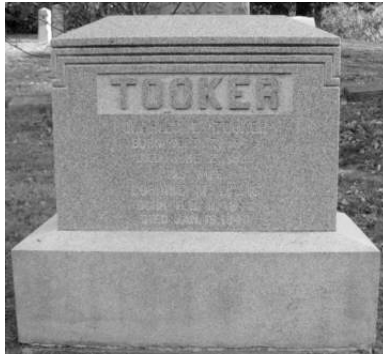

FAMILIES WOULD MOVE AWAY LEAVING THIS LITTLE ONE BEHIND UNVISITED AND ALONE. I AM PRESENTING TRYING TO CONNECT FAMILY MEMBERS OF TODAY TO NOTIFY THEM OF THESE SITES SO THEY CAN KNOW OF PAST FAMILY MEMBERS ARE AT CEDAR HILL. EVEN IF THIS IS THE LAST ISSUE OF '***FOREVERMORE ON CEDAR HILL***', BE ASSURED THAT I AM ALWAYS ON THE JOB AS THE HISTORIAN OF CEDAR HILL AND I AM ALWAYS RESEARCHING AND AVAILABLE. I AM TRILLED BY FAMILY MEMBERS WHO SEE THEIR FAMILY NAME IN THESE ISSUES AND HAVE CONTACTED ME FOR MORE INFORMATION. THEY LEARN FROM ME AND I FROM THEM.
