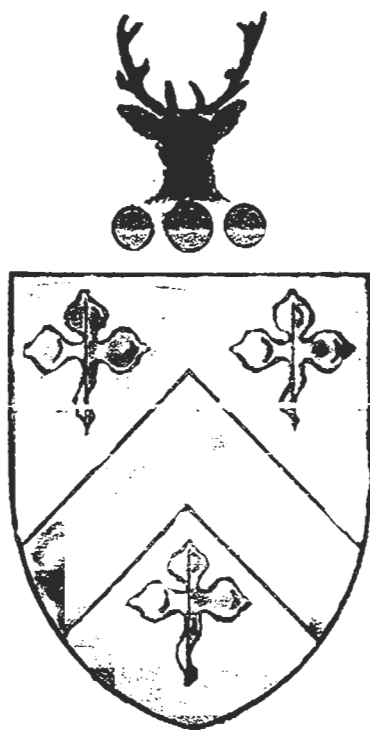

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AUTHOR'S PREFACE

Many of the published family records of early first generation Americans were prompted by the active part which those pioneers took in the making of Colonial history and/or by the accomplishments, importance etc, of one or more of their early descendants. In contrast, this work is a relatively unexciting outline of the descending genealogy of a previously unpublicised immigrant from England. His immediate family and their early offspring were quite ordinary people who, for the most part, made their living off the land. Never-the-less they were among those courageous, honest and industrious settlers who composed the principal segment of this continent's new inhabitants and who thus might be characterized as "the strong foundation of an emerging American citizenry".

The incompleteness of this initial listing of Hugh Roe descendants will soon be apparent to the reader because so many are missing after the fourth generation; particularly the lines from the two youngest of the three Roe grandsons. However, in keeping with an important principle of family research, this retired amateur genealogist/author thought it prudent to organize and publish the accumulated data, although limited, "before it is too late". The material thus becomes more widely available for correction and expansion in the future by anyone interested.

The record of descendants in each generation (after the second), similar to the usual published genealogies, is only half complete in a further respect because continuation is limited to the male (Roe/Rowe) lines. However, as the daughters of each family are listed chronologically with the sons, in each new generation, their marriage date, place and husband's name are included when known. Descendants of the recorded female children of any generation may thus establish their Roe/Rowe ancestry.

The author regrets the impossibility of extending the lineage of daughters in each family in-as-much as they are equal descendants. In the first place, quite a few births and marriages of daughters in early families are unrecorded. Secondly, the search for complete female lines, commencing with hundreds of different surnames, would be without end. Lastly, the research facilities and energy of this lone author are incapable of handling such a monumental task, in whatever time may be left; as the following account will testify.

Hugh Roe had only one son with a family but there were four married daughters! Thus; beginning the second generation with that 1:4 ratio and following simple geometric progression through the tenth generation, the calculated number of all descendants through those 300 odd years explodes to an astounding grand total of 641,890 persons! This is based on the actual count of children in each known male descendant's family; plus an estimated 2 sons and 2 daughters for each missing male descendant and each discontinued female descendant, in all remaining eight generations.

Since the average number of children of known Roe/Rowe male descendants as herein recorded actually exceeds the total of 4 used for all unknown descendants in calculation, the above mathematically estimated grand total of Hugh Roe descendants is very conservative. (The calculated number of missing descendants for each generation was even diminished by 12% to allow for those who died in infancy or never married; this being the average percentage for those categories among the known Roe/Rowe families) Since approximately 80% of the grand total, or some 513,000 persons, would be descended from those four daughters of the second generation, the impossible magnitude of any consistent effort to find and record all female lineage becomes apparent.

The numerical/decimal system adopted herein for an orderly recording of descendants, is an experiment concerning which constructive criticism is invited. The first number on the left clearly denotes the generation. The next number (1, 2 or 3) following the - and left of the decimal point, designates the male family branch of the third generation ie, Samuel II -1., John -2., Thomas -3..

The remaining numbers to the right of the decimal point provide (1) the order in which each descendant within a given family was born, and (2) maintenance of the same order, in some degree, for succeeding generations. The second objective is manifestly imperfect because the record is so incomplete, ie there is merely an assigned estimate of numbers for missing descendants.

All genealogies of this kind follow some plan of listing the children of each family in order of birth and then recording the families of the following generation in the same order. Often there is merely a listing of known descendants in family order, by generations, with a consecutive number assigned to each as he or she is recorded. Even such an indiscriminate system is essential for indexing, subsequent reference and unquestioned identification (because of the many given name duplications in all family records).

Perhaps some reader can suggest an improvement of the system used herein that is more explanatory and /or less confusing.

This work of genealogy, like most of its kind, makes use of abbreviations in the text to simplify both writing and reading. For the benefit of unacquainted readers, a list of such abbreviations follows. They correspond to standards adopted by The Connecticut Society of Genealogists, Inc.

The author wishes to acknowledge the interest and help of some twenty other descendants of Hugh Roe (see Chapter XIII) without whose substantial contributions, even this modest record would not have been possible. Likewise, the courtesy, cooperation and real assistance of many librarians, society curators etc, is greatly appreciated; particularly since their only reward will be a copy of this treatise.

Some of the data and narratives included herein are without documentation but there is no reason to question that they are substantially accurate. Doubtful records or presumptions are so indicated. (A little speculation brightens genealogy's sometime drabness.) More expert research in the future should yield corrections in detail and straighten out some of our conjecture.

In conclusion of this preface, it is the author's expectation that interested readers will respond by forwarding information to him concerning any missing descendants and also provide corrections/additions of data on known descendants. Hopefully, many of the "lost" Roes and Rowes, now listed merely as increasing numbers, will be found.

CHAPTER I

THE FIRST ROE (S) IN AMERICA

Recorded information about the first Roe families in America, including that of Hugh Roe, is meager and uncertain, when not confusing; and it may be that little more will be found. Hugh and a few possibly related contemporary immigrants with similar name could not have been wealthy nor overly educated since they were mainly settlers of the virgin land which supported them. Consequently, letters or other writings probably are non-existent. They were active Protestant church members but very few records have been discovered of the small congregations to which they belonged. Likewise, family Bibles for recording of births, marriages and deaths, were not yet in general use.

Hugh Roe may have been the first of his immediate family to emigrate from England to America. The consensus of all references and data secured indicate that he landed at or near Weymouth on the southern shore of the Massachusetts Bay Colony in 1642. There were, however, at least three other Roe's; John, David and Anthony, who came from England to Massachusetts at about the same time! John Roe, in fact, may have been the pioneer; as early as 1630, according to two sources, although another estimates it ca 1642. No ship passenger lists or other records have been found covering the arrivals of Hugh, John or David. Anthony Roe is listed in Bank's, 'English Emigrants to New England 1620-1650' from the parish of Meavy in Devonshire; landed in Portsmouth on the ship 'Mary and John'.

In addition, there was a John O. Row who came from England to the vicinity of Salem on the northern shore of the Massachusetts Bay Colony in the year 1640. His presence and considerable family genealogy has been researched (1965) and partially documented by Richard Herbert Tivey¹ of Pembroke, Mass. Also, there was a Henry Row who came to the Colony in 1635 and an Edward Row in 1650. Both were from England, so recorded in ship passenger lists that are included in a book entitled "Pioneers of Massachusetts", which the author found at the library of the London Society of Genealogists.

Two more early English emigrants to New England were Nicholas Rowe and Matthew Rowe: the last discovered in our search for possible Hugh Roe kin among those who sailed to that area before ca 1650. Nicholas Rowe (sp?) is included in a directory of "Ancestral Heads of New England Families 1620-1700", compiled and published by Frank R. Holmes. Nicholas is listed as a lawyer in Portsmouth in 1640 but there is no record of his arrival to the Colony. Matthew Rowe is recorded as a miller of East Haven, Conn and was there some time before 1653. He m Sarah Abbott of Branford, Conn and the sons from this marriage; John, b 1654 and Stephen, b 1660; began Rowe families which have flourished to date. There is no record of Matthew Rowe's landing in America: presumably at New Haven.

There is a reference to one more immigrant from England among the original American colonists during the first half of the 17th century; Edward Roe, age 17, landed in Virginia 4 July 1635 on the ship "Transport" from London. He is not considered as possible kin of Hugh Roe because the Virginia colony was practically another country. If he started a family later, which is unknown, they undoubtedly migrated south and west via Cumberland Gap as did so many of the Virginia colonists. Consequently, there would be little confusion with the early generation descendants of Hugh Roe and his New England/New York contemporaries who migrated west mainly via Ohio.

After 1650 there were, of course, more Roe/Row/Rowe emigrants from England to New England and other American colonies; also some from Ireland. None of these is considered as a possible close relative of Hugh Roe because there are no connecting data whatever; also a full generation gap had started.

Whether any of the eight other above recorded Roe/Row/Rowe emigrants to the still sparsely settled Massachusetts colonies were closely related to Hugh and/or to each other, may always remain unknown. The author has been unable to find any bona fide record of relation or a positive clue. There are, however a few interesting references, including the data given in Chapter II, which suggest that a close family relation hypothesis should not be wholly discarded on the theory of "mere coincidence". In support of this idea, Laurence W. Roe, one of the living 10th generation descendants recorded herein, reports a "legend" passed down in his line, that Hugh was "one of four or five brothers who came to America"! Also, a living descendant² of the John Roe mentioned above, has stated there is an identical "tradition" in his family!

It would appear that Hugh Roe stayed in Weymouth for at least 16 years after he arrived. It is unknown where David Roe and John Roe landed; perhaps within the Plymouth Colony, but the fact is that they moved on promptly; both to Long Island. John, who may have been the earliest and oldest, as previously mentioned, settled in Brookhaven near the eastern end. David was in Flushing, now part of New York City, in the early 1640 s. Anthony Roe eventually settled in Falmouth (now Maine) according to the Holmes directory. The extreme (at that time) geographical separation of these four Roes supports the proposition that they were not closely related. Members of the same family tended to settle and live close to one another in the pioneer days.

The early descendants of David Roe and John Roe have been well established and recorded in two fine volumes of genealogy published in 1926 by Clarence Almon Torrey; himself a descendant of David, a recognized genealogist and ex-librarian. Mr. Torrey's extensive research and original objective was for the printed volume on David Roe but a coincident mass of additional data which he received from descendants of John Roe, led him to prepare and publish that booklet also. Both families had flourished contemporaneously in Long Island, Connecticut, New Jersey and upper New York so that many descendants were confused or ignorant as to their David or John Roe ancestry.

The volume on David Roe was revised and enlarged in 1958 by Mr. Torrey and a cousin, Charles Harvey Roe. During their accumulation and separation of many more records, they also discovered scattered fragments about Roes not descended from either David or John. This caused them to suggest the probability of another contemporary early Roe immigrant, whom we now know to have been Hugh.

The foregoing lengthy paragraphs about David Roe and John Roe are included in this record for two reasons; first, to indicate the likelihood that they were not closely related to Hugh (Mr. Torrey believed they were not related to each other); second, and more important, to save future Roe family researchers from undue bewilderment when they discover descendants of Hugh, David or John in the same area at the same time.

John O. Row, Henry Row and Edward Row, referred to in the third paragraph, should not be ruled out as possible kin of Hugh simply because of the difference in surname spelling. It is unlikely again, however, that they were immediately related to one another, judging from the data included in the Tivey research.

John O. Row had two sons: John and Hugh, who were mentioned specifically in his will, but apparently they used the Roe spelling. We find these data in a record of (American colony) "Marriages before 1699", compiled by W. Clemons:

John Roe, m Mary Dickison 27 Sept 1663, Gloucester, Mass

Hugh Roe, m (1) Rachel Langton 10 June 1667, Gloucester, Mass

Hugh Roe, m (2) Mary Prince 16 Sept 1675, Gloucester, Mass

The given name duplication, chronology and place (close to Salem) leave little doubt that they were, indeed, the sons of John O. Row.

The fourth paragraph references to Nicholas and Matthew Rowe likewise have been included to avoid confusion more than to suggest kinship with Hugh Roe. At the same time, the point should be stressed again that the difference in spelling is not overly significant. All three spellings were and are common in England, with Roe predominating there and Rowe the most prevalent in Ireland. Also, we know from experience, that family name spelling in early days was careless or frequently was changed deliberately.

There is no validity to suggestions that one spelling was preferred by the more educated members of a family over another spelling. All three spellings (and some variations) are now found among important families or prominent members of society in England and America. Spelling variation was no exception in the Hugh Roe family. His will was recorded "Rhoe" and several of his great grandsons changed to Rowe; perhaps for political reason- see Moses 4-2.02.

CHAPTER II

ANCESTRY OF HUGH ROE

There is no recorded proof that Hugh, David, John and Matthew (Rowe) emigrated from England, as there is for the other "Roe" pioneers recorded in Chapter I, but family references to the fact plus their English names, arrival in Massachusetts etc, is very good evidence. The search for Hugh Roe's ancestry is equally devoid of positive identification but the four published items which follow are reasonable clues, presented in order of strength.

The first and best reference is certainly correct so far as definite connection with Hugh Roe, but the information as received included no source. It simply listed Hugh as 7th in a line; with Thomas 6, Thomas 5, Elisha 4; and the statement that he emigrated from England 1642, "to Suffield, Conn." Presumably, the previous three generations had been established by someone. That would take the origin of the line back to about 1450!

The second item fits the first in some respects, which is intriguing and somewhat confirming. It was received from a descendant³ of Mary Roe Darell, dau of a 17th century Thomas Roe in England. The family resembles the above lineage because of chronology and given name similarity. Said Thomas Roe of St. Mary Aldermary parish in Devonshire, had a son(s) John and/or Thomas in addition to the daughter. Mary Roe was m 27 Dec 1619, the only specific date given. She would thus have been Hugh Roe's aunt if the said Thomas Roe (Sr.) was indeed Hugh's grf. (P.S. Hugh Roe's first dau was named Mary!)

The third item discovered has but barely possible connection to our Hugh Roe but is included, first; because it commences with the uncommon Christian name Hugh and, second; because of it's 17th century incidence. Among the card file references in the library of the London Society of Genealogists, there were many Roe, Row and Rowe items before and during that period (including a Lord Mayor of London who killed himself!). But there was only one item with the given name Hugh! It was brief: "Hugh Row of Great Torrington, Devonshire (once more) m Elizabeth Bond who d in childbirth 20 Apr 1659; s Hugh Row". Since our Hugh Roe in America was then about 42 years old, it is obvious that Elizabeth Bond was not his mother, but she could have been a second wife of Hugh Row Sr. If so, the chronology is such that the son mentioned and our Hugh Roe could have been one and the same; or perhaps cousins.

While this third consideration of Hugh Roe's ancestry is very dubious, of course, it does support a remotely possible family connection for him. It is a more logical connection, however, for John O. Row with the same spelling, whose son Hugh is listed twice in the book "American Marriages before 1609". The Secretary of the London Society of Genealogists was of the opinion that repetition of the unusual name Hugh strongly suggests some family relation regardless of the Row/Roe spelling disparity.

The fourth and last clue to possible ancestry of Hugh Roe was received from a descendant⁴ just before our publication and seems the least plausible. It is included, however, to keep the register of discovered clues as complete as possible. This item is an undocumented statement by one C. H. King in his "King Family" genealogy, that Hugh Roe was the 'son of Edward Roe and w Eleanor'. In the light of the apparently authentic first reference given above, it occurs to the author that C. H. King was confused, as others have been, by the Gloucester marriage records of the younger Hugh Roe; also by the record of the older immigrant Edward Row, who lived close to Gloucester and could have been assumed as the father. This, of course, is conjecture.

Further discussion of these clues only belabors the point. The record of Hugh Roe's ancestry remains obscure and his birthplace unknown. There appears to be a possibility, in spite of the absence of a record of kinship between the Roe, Row and Rowe emigrants, that the English ancestors of two or more of them were some how related. In addition to the "legends", there are enough coincidents of name, time and place, to retain the idea. Perhaps some future family researcher will unlock the mystery or declare it dead.

Of course the main item of unfinished research should be an effort to confirm the record of descendency of Hugh Roe⁷ from Thomas Roe⁶ etc and to establish his place of birth. Success in this would most likely uncover some connection with other 16th and 17th century Roe, Row and Rowe families in England. A wealth of data exists there to be examined because of the good records maintained by the Church of England parishes in all counties. Devonshire records in particular should be searched on the strength of the three references herein to 17th century Roe s in that county who could well be among Hugh's ancestors.

As to the genesis of the Roe family, two or three professional genealogists state that it's origin, including all three spellings, is Norse. They say it dates back to the 8th and 9th centuries when the Vikings invaded England and Ireland. At least two authors say that the name was taken from the small European roe deer which is included on the heraldic crest of the family!

In opposition, Beulah Sanford Osborn France, a contributor to "Five Hundred First Families of America", published in 1971, says that the Roe family is very ancient and actually takes it's name from Rollo. "Rollo was a viking of Norway who landed in Normandy, married a daughter of Charles, King of France, and became the first Duke of Normandy. The 'lls' were dropped under the softening influence of the French language and at the time of William the Conqueror, the name became Roo and Roe".

The above accounts of name origin, as well as the coat-of-arms on the cover, have been added to this modest, possibly dull, family history to bring it some levity and "window dressing". Some of it may be categorized as fantasy since there are no proofs of source given. Authentic coats-of-arms and unquestioned ancestral lines to ancient times generally are limited to royalty or to dukedom and earldom.

Many so called family coats-of arms, based on ancient heraldry symbols, have been conceived by people with a commercial enterprise in mind rather than being the genuine emblem of a family for centuries, as is implied. Otherwise there would be no copyrights involved. Acceptance or use may be dependent on appeal to pride rather than on modest fact. Incidentally, the Roe/Rowe coat-of-arms on the cover was described by Beulah Sanford Osborn France (reference above) and was drawn by the author, with the aid of a standard dictionary on heraldry.

The reputed family motto is "Virtute et Valore", which, of course, is translated, "virtue and valor".

Despite the suggestion to downgrade these "fantasy" references, the following facts should be contemplated. If it were possible to establish our ancestry for say twice the number of generations as are recorded herein, we would almost have to find characters of historical note. (The Mormons have done this to a considerable degree) Such thought is prompted by the simple realization that this record of Hugh Roe descendants extends over one-third of a millennium and covers one-sixth of the time since Christ!

CHAPTER III
THE FIRST GENERATION

Hugh Roe, as progenator of a new lineage in America, represents what genealogists refer to as the first generation. If he had any immigrant brothers, as discussed in Chapter I, each would represent the first generation of a separate lineage.

It is believed that Hugh was born in England ca 1617. No birth date has been found nor a record of his age at any specific time. The fact that his first wife's name or anything concerning her, is unknown, suggests that he was married in England, probably about 1638/40, before leaving for America.

The chronology, reasonable geographic proximity and repetition of an uncommon name, initially led the author to suspect that the John Roe and Hugh Roe, whose Gloucester marriages were recorded in 1663 and 1667, might have been immigrant sons of our Hugh Roe. Later evidence proved they were the sons of John O. Row; all as discussed in Chapter I. It seems quite probable, therefore, that there were no Roe siblings in Hugh's family when he landed in America and he even may have been married (soon) thereafter.

Three daughters were born to Hugh Roe and his first wife in Weymouth before she died there about 1653/4. They were as follows:

- i Mary b ca 1643
- ii Esther b ca 1645
- iii Sarah b before 1653

Hugh was married again ca 1654-5 in Weymouth to Abigail ----- whose b, date and place, are unknown. Four more children were born to this union:

- iv Samuel b 14 Jan 1656, Weymouth
- v Abigail b ca 1660 -----?
- vi Peter b ca 1662 -----?
- vii Elizabeth b ca 1664 -----?

There is no record of Hugh Roe's occupation in Weymouth between 1642 and ca 1657. However, some time after the birth of Samuel he seems to have begun a search for "greener pastures". The first move may have been to Martha's Vineyard; one descendant having reported he was there in 1658. Then we find two brief items that Hugh Roe was a "Sealer of Leather" in Hartford in 1663, this being the first indication of his occupation. These references seem to be confirmed by word from a living desc that he was a "currier". (The Britanica, in describing the processing of leather, says that "currying is rubbing of special oils into the cleaned tanned hide to fill the pores and render the leather soft and pliable").

Records of other colonial towns have been found which include "sealer of leather" among listed officials. Yankee Magazine has defined such a colonial official as one who inspected tanned hides and approved same for sale. Perhaps Hugh Roe was sufficiently expert to be both a currier and a judge of quality of hides finished by others.

Further notes or references to other migrations of Hugh and his family during this period are minimal and confusing as to exact time and location. One states that he was made a "Freeman" in Connecticut (and/or of the Congregational church?) at Hartford in 1669; another, that he lived south of Little River, also in 1669. Two further items indicate that he was in Salem, Conn, at about the same time.

That the family was in the southeast area of Connecticut during the early part of that 1657-1660 period seems quite certain because the oldest dau Mary was m in 1661 to William Dudley, Jr. of Saybrook, Conn which is close to Salem. That they lived in or near Hartford later on is confirmed by the marriage ca 1669 of the next oldest dau Sarah to Daniel Warner of near by Farmington.

There is one conflicting and confusing reference, however, in Chamberlain's "History of Weymouth" Vol 4. It narrates that Hugh Roe was granted land there 14 Dec 1663, mentions his w Abigail and includes the property description. This suggests two hypotheses: first, that some of the dates of Hugh's presence in Connecticut at that time may be in error; second, that the family returned to Weymouth for a short period between 1659 and 1660. The latter seems unlikely because of distance and because they presumably left originally to find a better life. In considering this reference, it must be realized also that Town histories, written nearly 300 years after the incidents took place, can well be in error.

Although accounts of the Hugh Roe family moves during the above period remain unclear, the last record of a new home is correct with no doubt even though the exact date is unknown. Hugh was granted land and finally settled in the Town of Suffield, then in Hampshire County Massachusetts, north of Hartford and just west of the Connecticut River. This was before 1674 because he was one of 38 who voted that year at Suffield's first Town meeting. Hugh Roe unquestionably was among the earliest settlers of Suffield, evidenced by the fact that he and his s Samuel had 80 acres, "bounded west on High Streete, north on Feather Streete, extending east 3/4 of a mile." "High Streete" is now Main Street so the Roe property as described, constituted much of the southeast portion of the present inner town!

The Town of Suffield was founded in 1670 by John Pynchon of Springfield. It was previously named Stoney Brooke Plantation which he had purchased from the Indians for 30 Pounds the year before. Five parcels of land within it's boundaries were granted in 1670, at 4 pence per acre, to Suffield's first bona fide settlers. The Town was laid out in 1671 and more grants followed. The date of Hugh Roe's grant is unknown but, because of it's location, it must have been in 1671 or 1672. With Hugh and his w Abigail when they settled in Suffield were the four younger ch, ranging from Samuel, age 15-17, down to Elizabeth, age 5-7.

Hugh Roe's some time craft as a leather finisher has been reported but it seems likely that his interest and principal living was in "tilling of the soil". This belief is founded on his steady movement westward and north from the thin rocky coastal land to the broad and rich Connecticut River valley; still a fine farming area. Also, in Spencer's "History of Suffield", Hugh Roe is referred to several times as "Goodman Roe". The term "Goodman" or yeoman reflects the English ancestry of the founders and settlers of Suffield as well as the class structure of that society. John Pynchon and his aides who developed Stoney Brooke Plantation into the Town of Suffield and who owned the several mills etc, were considered "Men of Estate" or gentlemen. The shop keepers and farmers were "Goodmen".

In 1675 most of Suffield was burned by the Indians and the settlers fled to Springfield. It was a dark year for every family and there is no record of a Town meeting until 1676 when they returned and rebuilt from the ashes. Apparently the settlers formed some kind of military home guard at this time for better protection. In 1678 Hugh Roe petitioned the Town court for "exemption from military service" on the grounds of infirmity, and it was granted.

This period had to be extremely hard on the Hugh Roe family and all others in Suffield, but they survived and ultimately thrived. Whether Hugh's infirmity

was the result of the Indian attack and ensuing year of hardship is unknown but he was then 61 and apparently was soon unable to do active farm work. He was licensed to open a tavern or inn in 1681, probably Suffield's first. Also, he was Town constable during his last few years, 1684-5-8.

Most of the anecdotes about early Suffield life, in the foregoing paragraphs, are taken from the excellent "Biography of a Town", written by Robert Hayden Alcorn and published in 1970 as a memento of Suffield's 300th anniversary. It contains many references to Hugh Roe and a few of his descendants in the early chapters. After all, at least five generations of Roes lived there!

Hugh Roe d in Suffield 5 Aug 1689 at the estimated age of 72. His will, filed in North Hampton, divided his estate between his s Peter and the living daus; the elder son Samuel having d a year or two earlier. It also provided that his wife Abigail be cared for by Peter. Presumably she was ailing which seems to be confirmed by her death a month later, 3 Sept 1689.

There is no known place of burial in Suffield of Hugh and Abigail Roe.

Incidentally, the above reference to North Hampton makes this a good place to clear the reader's possible confusion concerning Suffield's (State) allegiance during it's early period. Boundaries between Connecticut and Massachusetts had not been definitely established and it has been mentioned that Suffield was in Hampshire County, Mass. The name Suffield actually is a corruption of "South Field" (of North Hampton) which the Court granted John Pynchon to name his subdivision of "Stoney Brooke Plantation". North Hampton was (and still is) the seat of the Court of extensive Hampshire County, Mass which then included Springfield and other ares to the south along "Ye Greate River" which they called the Connecticut River.

It was not until 1749 that Suffield became a part of Connecticut when it's citizens decided that Connecticut had a more stable government than Massachusetts.

CHAPTER IV

THE SECOND GENERATION

As stated in the Preface, the female descendants of Hugh Roe are separately recorded only in this chapter covering the second generation because it would have been impossible to continue further. The exception for this generation is made because the data were available on each of Hugh's four daughters who grew up and married. It also provides a more complete and interesting background for this new Roe family in America, which may help future family researchers.

The Wm Dudley Jr family, like so many in early colonial history, was large and important. The descendants are legion and several other family genealogies in print, trace back to this beginning. William's occupation is unknown but he was a Deacon of the Saybrook church.

Mary Roe Dudley was m (2) after William d ca 1700 and when she was about 58 years old; to William Dart of Saybrook. She lived to be about 86 and d in Saybrook in 1727 or 1728.

The above record of Sarah Roe's two Warner marriages, each time as a second wife, has been most confusing to Warner family historians. The main reason is that her husbands (1) Daniel of Farmington and (2) John of Springfield Mass, were

not related. Daniel's f John Warner landed in Watertown on the ship "Increase" in 1635. John's f, also named John Warner, came to Ipswich Mass in 1637 with his f William and a bro Daniel. The belief that the two families were unrelated is based on the fact that they landed in different places, two years apart, and that as emigrant families, they were a generation apart. All the same, the uncommon repetition of given names is confusing and suggests earlier common anc.

Sarah's h Daniel d in Farmington in 1680, three years before she re-m and apparently moved to Springfield Mass where her 2nd h John lived. The only other record of this family is that the youngest s Nathaniel lived to be 72 and d in Suffield 11 July 1756, where his mo's family settled!

Samuel never m and d quite young, 1 Mar 1687/8 in Suffield, age 32. We wonder if he did not have some illness or physical disability, possibly resulting from the Indian attack shortly after the family settled in Suffield.

It is apparent that the family had much affection for Samuel. His father included him in ownership of the original Suffield land grant. Both of his older half-sis's named a s Samuel, presumably for him. His only bro Peter obviously wanted a s named Samuel, as indicated by Samuel I, the first b who d in infancy, and Samuel II, the very next s born!

There is no reference to Samuel's occupation but he undoubtedly farmed the new land in Suffield with his f until he d.

When his older bro Samuel d rather young and un-m, Peter was left as the only one to carry on the family name. Thus, all further Roe/Rowe desc, as recorded herein, are from Peter and his three sons; Samuel II, John and Thomas.

Incidentally, the name Thomas given to Peter's youngest s, repeating what we note to have happened in his older half-sis Sarah's family, does support the Chap II reference that a Thomas Roe in England was indeed their grf! One might contemplate further that Peter's 2nd s John could have been named for an English uncle or gr uncle but that is less convincing; John being such a common and popular name always.

The records indicate that Peter Roe livin North Hampton for about three years after his marriage in 1688 or 1689 and that the first 2 ch were b there. Nothing is known concerning Peter's occupation during this short period. Apparently he moved back to Suffield some two years after his f & mo d in 1689 because the remaining ch were all b there.

It would appear that Peter farmed the Suffield land that he inherited and it is recorded that he was granted another 40 acres. He also had a share in developing the Suffield Iron Works, established in 1721. This proved to be an important colonial industry, as will be narrated later.

Two references to public acts of Peter Roe, included in Robert Hayden Alcorn's history, are indicative of his strong character, even though the Town court fined him in both instances. The first case had to do with Peter's open remonstrance to practices of a clergyman of the Congregational church- actions for which said clergyman ultimately was asked to leave! The second case was in 1686 when Peter and one Samuel Kent violently objected at a Town meeting, to the Pynchon's Committee charter which allowed only holders of land grants to vote. The meeting broke up in an uproar with Peter Roe the principal figure. Again, he was later vindicated when a more democratic voting practice was voted.

It is evident that upon Peter Roe's death 4 Feb 1738/9, he had acquired considerable property and was a person of high standing in the community. His will, recorded in the ledger at North Hampton, occupies 4 pages. In addition to his farming activity and interest in the new iron forge works, he served the Town as Constable, "Fence Viewer" and as a Selectman, over different periods. No date is recorded of the death of Peter's w, Sarah Remington Roe.

Despite considerable search, no record of ch of this marriage has been found. It seems barely possible that the marriage of Elizabeth Roe to Thomas Merrill of Saybrook came about through her oldest half-sis Mary Dudley. Mary, of course, remained in Saybrook after her marriage in 1661, when the Hugh Roe family livin that area although Elizabeth was not yet born. Perhaps the William Dudley and Hugh Roe families maintained contact through the intervening 24 years despite the 50 odd miles on the Connecticut River between Saybrook and Suffield!

A lone reference states that Elizabeth Roe Merrill d before 1693 and that Thos. Merrill m(2) Hannah Hall. Thomas Merrill d 7 Nov 1711.

CHAPTER V

THE THIRD GENERATION

There is no record of Samuel Roe's occupation but he probably helped his f with the farm work for the most part. It is possible, of course, that he was occupied to some extent in the new iron works.

One note of Suffield history, estimated ca 1730, states that Samuel joined with several Feather St neighbors in an interesting commercial enterprise. They built a dam across Stoney Brooke that created a lake on their property in which they raised salmon and shad. The Town permit for this was granted on condition that no fish be barrelled for market as long as townspeople appeared to purchase same at "five pence per pound for salmon and a penny each for shad".

Samuel Roe II d 23 Oct 1732 of unknown cause when he was under 40 years of age. This was 6 or 7 years before his f Peter d. Samuel's youngest s Abijah was then only a babe in arms, while the oldest, Samuel III was 15. With six ch to care for thereafter it is likely that his w Mary had her hands full even though young Samuel and Joseph were old enough to help.

Mary Roe was m(2) in Aug 1741 to Daniel Day of the neighboring town of Simsbury Conn, almost 9 years after Samuel d and 2 years after the death of her f-in-law Peter. The family moved to Simsbury then, where the younger ch grew up and m. No record has been found of the death of Mary Hall Roe (Day).

The list of ch above concludes with the strange semi-duplication of vi Dan and vii Daniel which suggests misspelling or an error in the bpt record from which the data were obtained. There are later records of marriage for both Dan and Daniel, however, and since there were no contemporary Dan or Daniel cousins, it is concluded that the record is correct.

John Roe m(2) 17 May 1758 Suffield; Lydia Remington, a widow. Undoubtedly she had been the w of one of his Remington cousins. There is no record of the death of his first w, Joannah Burbank Roe.

Nothing specific is known concerning John Roe's occupation. It is the author's guess, however, that he was more interested in the Suffield Iron Works than either of his brothers and less active in farming. This idea is based on the known activity of his youngest s Daniel in the iron industry, plus the following statement (in context) from a 1960 research article on the subject by William L. Warren, Director of the Litchfield (Conn) Historical Society:

"Members of the Rowe family had been pioneers in the iron industry in Connecticut. For three generations they had been workers in iron in Suffield. Young Daniel Rowe was well qualified to undertake running such a business when he decided to strike out for himself and buy the Litchfield forge on the Bantam River. "

Whether or not John Roe began to spell the name Rowe during his lifetime is unknown. It is apparent, however, that some of his sons and their descendants adopted Rowe. No record has been found of the death of John Roe or his 2nd w.

It is evident from the foregoing that Thomas Roe favored a large family which was common among early settlers. Perhaps the size was too large, however, for his land or occupation in Suffield to support. The fact is that in 1745, after the first ten ch had been b, he moved south to Saybrook (where there were many distant cousin ch of his f's oldest half sis Mary and probably of his f's youngest sis Elizabeth). The record of this move is simply a "Transfer of Thomas Roe and wife to the 4th Church of Christ in Saybrook", listed in the Suffield church.

No further biographical information has been obtained on Thomas Roe and this large family; with one exception! His 3rd s Zebulon was in Nova Scotia from ca 1749 until the Revolution. Possibly the whole family moved there at that time. It was a fertile land whereas the coastal area around Saybrook surely was not. Family migrations westward into New York were infrequent and dangerous at that time due to the prevalence of Indian attack and massacre.

No record has been found of date and place of Thomas Roe's death nor that of his w Elizabeth Purchase Roe.

CHAPTER VI

THE FOURTH GENERATION

Important note: after this generation there are so many more missing descendants than known desc, that it would be futile to record the numbered gaps with a note for each, stating the last known ancestor. Therefore, commencing with this generation, the listed name of each male desc of whom there are no known ch will be followed by an asterisk *.

In the record of each following generation, a number or series of numbers with a double ** will be placed in the proper sequence of known desc merely to indicate a "gap" of unknown desc. The increasing numbers with each generation, of course, will signify the normal multiplication of desc; based on the estimate given in the author's preface.

There are no recorded incidents about the early life of Samuel Roe III in Suffield. He could not have had an easy time after his f d when he was 15, until he was m at age 24; just before his mo re-m and moved to Simsbury. Very likely he helped farm the extensive land owned by his grf Peter and, of course, he could have been employed in the iron works as he became older.

It is clear, however, that there was beginning to be too little land among the Roes in Suffield to support all of them. Samuel III was thus, the first known desc of Hugh Roe to have the urge to migrate west. Exactly when he moved is unknown but, judging from marriage data of his ch, it was just before the time of the Revolution. The danger from Indian attack and massacre in New York had diminished by that time; moreover, Samuel's move west was only about 50 miles from Suffield

Samuel RoeIII and his family occupied a farm near Millerton in the Town of North East (now Amenia), Dutchess Co NY; barely across the Conn line. There is evidence that several other Suffield families moved to the same area at the same time, eg Barlow s and Spencer s, who were related by marriage. There is no evidence or indication that this particular migration had any other motive beyond basic economics. The strong Loyalists in Conn mostly moved to Canada. Also, some 1971 research at the University of Conn, uncovered no Roes (or Rowe s) among British sympathizers. It is odd, however, that Samuel who moved from Conn, maintained the Roe family name spelling, while his brothers and cousins (mostly) who remained in the Suffield area at that critical time, changed the spelling to Rowe; continued by their desc.

Samuel Roe III was in his mid 50s when they moved to the new land in New York but he had 5 or 6 grown sons to help him. They were a rugged lot of pioneers as is evident in the chapters to follow. At least three of the sons continued the westward migration to new land after marrying and many of the grss did the same.

There is no record of Joseph Roe's occupation in Simsbury as a young man after he m and fathered the above considerable family. It is likely that he helped his step-f, Daniel Day, and/or his f-in-law, William Rice, with the farming of their lands; note 2nd paragraph below.

The most important and tragic event in Joseph's life occurred soon when the Crown colonies became engaged in the French and Indian War. He enlisted in the King's service in 1762 as a foot soldier, after the Connecticut General Assembly voted to equip an expedition to attack Havana Cuba. More than 200 of the Conn company died of small pox, malaria, dysentery etc during the siege, among them Joseph Roe. There are accounts of this expedition in the State (Conn), Simsbury and Suffield libraries. It resulted in British victory after some two months of siege and fighting.

Joseph was only 43 years old when he d in Cuba in 1762. Similar to his f he left a large family, the youngest again a baby. There is no record that his w Elinor remarried. There is a reference that the family probably liv with her f, William Rice; confirmed by the fact that no property was involved in the filing of Joseph's will.

Joseph Roe renewed the Covenant in 1757 at the Granby Conn Congregational church. There is no record of death of his w, Elinor Rice Roe.

On 18 Apr 1750, some 7 months after Peter Roe m, he purchased property in Salmon Brook from his f-in-law, Nehemiah Lee, for **200** pounds. He must have then built the fine house which still stands there (208 Salmon Brook St) as the home of the Salmon Brook Historical Society because the Society labels it ca 1750.

Peter sold this property 14 Sept 1753 to his bro Abijah for the sum of 540 pounds, indicating that he did indeed add the dwelling to it.

It is concluded that Peter Roe moved away from Salmon Brook after selling the property to his bro Abijah as there is no further record of him there nor has any record of his death been found. Probably he migrated westward.

Abijah was a blacksmith; perhaps emanating from the family's interest in the iron forge business in Suffield. He seems to have been the only s of Samuel II to change the name spelling; continued by his desc.

While raising a large family Abijah also was a substantial citizen. He added property to that purchased from his bro and built the blacksmith shop across the road from the dwelling. He livethere nearly 60 years until he d, for which reason the dwelling is still called the "Abijah Rowe house".

In 1786, for reasons unknown, the Salmon Brook parish of the Town of Simsbury was changed to the Town of Granby. Abijah d in Granby 24 Sept 1812. His w Deborah preceded him, 8 Nov 1807.

No further biography of Moses Rowe II discovered. Moses may have been the first of his generation, however, to change the family name spelling. The others (known) were his cousins Abijah and Zebulon as well as his bro Daniel; all during the period just before the Revolution. It raises this question; was the change to Rowe motivated by the strong anti British feeling around Suffield ? Could they have thought Rowe was less Anglican than Roe ?

The beautiful home that Moses II built ca 1772 stands today on the east side of Suffield's Main St as one of it's finest and an excellent example of colonial architecture. It's location indicates that Moses owned and perhaps farmed, a portion of the original Hugh Roe grant which was "bounded on the west by High Streete" (now Main St).

There is no record of death of Moses Rowe II but the Congregational church granted dismissal 13 June 1811 to his widow, Huldah Rowe, to join another church.

Evidently Daniel Rowe started quite young in the Suffield Iron Works which suggests that his f John (3-2.01) may have been more active in the business than either of Daniel's uncles after his grf Peter Roe helped to create it. In March 1773 young Daniel bought half interest in the Litchfield (Conn) Iron Works, along with a near by farm where he moved with his w and infant s.

Soon after Daniel Rowe moved, his new business became very active, as did all iron works; supplying equipment for the Continental Army. Daniel served as principal operator and owner of the Litchfield works until 1794 when he sold his interest; although he continued to work there until 1801. He then moved to Montague, Hampshire Co Mass and continued further work in the iron forge business. That is the last account of Daniel and there is no record of his death.

Zebulon Rowe may have moved from Saybrook to Nova Scotia as early as 1748 when he was 16 or 17 because one account states he was m there and the record indicates that Zebulon Jr was b in 1749 ! Possibly he migrated there with the family of his f Thomas since no record of that large family has come to light in Saybrook after the youngest ch (twins) were b there 1 Nov 1748. If that happened Zebulon could have been m in Saybrook and Zebulon Jr b there before moving.

It seems improbable, though possible, that Zebulon moved alone to Nova Scotia and started a family at such an early age. The date of Zebulon Jr's birth is established only by a record of him as a Revolutionary war pensioner in 1840 at age 91. Perhaps there is an error in that record.

The move to Nova Scotia by Zebulon and perhaps by his f's whole family can be rationalized by the fact that the Saybrook coastal land is agriculturally poor. Many early Mass and Conn family expansions were to the fertile Nova Scotia peninsula rather than to the west where there was great danger of Indian attack.

The first actual record of Zebulon Rowe is that of his military service in N S during the early part of the Revolution. He was a captain in the militia which was formed by Col. Jonathan Eddy when friction developed with England. Zebulon was ordered to spy out conditions at the British Ft Cumberland and did visit and examine same "without exciting suspicion". Col Eddy tried to secure aid from General Washington to attack the fort but was unsuccessful and decided to attack regardless. Before the attack, a party with Zebulon in command, boarded and captured a supply laden British sloop; without a shot being fired. Soon after, however, those patriots were driven from Nova Scotia to the mainland.

The Maine Historical Records show that Col Eddy and Capt Zebulon Rowe were among the "Refugees from Nova Scotia". Zebulon Rowe Jr (then about 16/17) also was included in Col Eddy's list of military refugees. No date is given for the "retreat" of military forces from N S to Mass (now Me). It must have been before 1776 because Zebulon had m again before then and fathered a dau that yr.

How Zebulon supported his new and rapidly growing family at that critical time

in history is a question because the refugees were homeless. Col Eddy persisted in his efforts to have his patriotic militia recognized in spite of their defeat and he was eventually successful. In 1781 the General Court granted Zebulon 750 acres in Eddington as payment for military service. Zebulon was living in Orrington Me then and did not occupy the Eddington property until 1792.

Presumably Zebulon continued farming after the war. He d in Eddington 5 Oct 1817.

The Town of Suffield history lists Thomas Roe as a veteran of the French and Indian War. It would appear, therefore, that young Thomas was back in Suffield for enlistment at this time regardless of where the remaining part of his f's large family were living. There is no record at all of Samuel Roe IV except the above 1790 census. He probably m in Suffield before his f and family moved. It is very doubtful that he served in the Revolution or there would be some reference. He was about 33 then and probably did migrate with his f's family, Barlows, Spencer s and others from Suffield to the Town of North East in Dutchess co NY.

Undoubtedly Samuel IV moved again, perhaps with one of his sons after they were grown. This assumption is based on his disappearance from Dutchess co before the next census. A guess would be Albany co because there were many Roes there after 1800

It is clear that Phineas Roe had the common urge to move west, aided by the usual reason that there were too many younger brothers (some married) for the family's Dutchess co NY land to support. It is unknown when Phineas moved; probably before 1800. Perhaps he moved more than once after the 1790 census listing (above), Regardless, the next record of him is the 1810 census for Schoharie co NY in the remote Town of Broome. That listing is with no ch but the same census lists Heman and Ansel, his sons, as neighboring heads of families. His other s and the dau undoubtedly m also in the meantime and livelsewhere.

Phineas Roe evidently d in the Town of Broome NY between 1810 and 1820 because only his w Mary appears in the 1820 Schoharie census as family head. There is no record of date and place of Mary Botsford Roe's death.

Daniel Rowe was one of only three desc of Hugh Roe who served in the Continental army during the Revolutionary War (Zebulon 4-3.05 and his s Zebulon Jr were the two others). Possibly there were others among the many missing desc but none could be established. Daniel was a private in one Capt Abel Pettibone's company of Connecticut in 1777. He was then 18 years old.

There is no record of Daniel's occupation during the immediate years after the war when he m and started a family in Granby. In 1792 he moved to Stephentown Rensselaer co NY, just over the Mass border. Presumably Daniel started farming there and in 1802 he purchased land from the Van Rensselaer estate near Stephentown. He remained there the rest of his life while the ch grew up and m in that area.

Apparently Daniel changed the spelling of his name about the time of the war or when he moved and the Rowe spelling has been continued by his desc. Again, there is no evident reason for the change. The author's conjecture that Daniel's uncle Abijah and cousins changed to Rowe because they thought it less English than Roe, seems far fetched. Perhaps this name changing was a popular whim at the time or resulted from careless spelling- not uncommon at that time.

It is evident from the above list that Finson Rowe was the most prolific of Hugh Roe's desc up to that time. (A search and extension of this line alone, including families of m dau s, through the remaining generations to the present, would take years to do and would require volumes)

Finson owned and operated a general store in Eddington most of his active life. He also had a store in Brewer Me where Thomas was b in 1813, but apparently he returned to Eddington.

In his early m life Finson served in the Mass militia. He was an ensign in the 3rd Reg of the 1st Brigade, 10th Div, during the period of 1803-1808. He d 29 Oct 1846. His w Polly d 6 Oct 1871. Both are buried in Eddington.

Heman Roe was "grown up" when his f moved ca 1795/1800 from Dutchess co NY and eventually settled in the remote and sparsely populated Schoharie River valley below Middleburgh NY. Probably he was not m before the move but he had acquired a w and his own farm property with a dwelling before the 1810 census. After 1830, through 1846, Heman and Lucy Roe deeded parts of this farm to their sons Elizur, Heman Jr, Myron and Silas.

Heman Roe was a member of the local militia during the War of 1812. When an epidemic depleted the regular forces defending the northern border of NY, he and others were drafted into active service for the 1813 campaign.

There is no further record of this family. Analysis of the 1820 census in comparison with the 1810 census suggests that Ansel and his w died during the interim leaving the ch with his mo, Mary (Botsford) Roe. Uzziel (1st name may have been William) Roe reached manhood in 1797, about a year before the last of his f's 12 ch arrived, which made a considerable family to support. Thus, Uzziel m soon thereafter and struck out on his own via the "westward trail". This was ca 1799.

It is evident from the different places of birth of Daniel Rowe's ch that he began
to seek "greener pastures" between 1804 and 1811. He owned land in Camillus
Onandaga co NY by that time, presumably farming it to support his family, There
is one reference, however, that he worked on construction of the Erie canal. It
was commenced in 1817 and since Camillus is close to it's course through On-
andaga co, that note rings true. Furthermore, by 1822 Daniel was in Clarkson
Monroe co NY, some 80 miles west, near Parma; which is right on the canal!

Daniel Rowe Jr and his family pulled up stakes for the last time in 1835. They
journeyed via horse drawn wagon from Clarkson to Buffalo; thence across the

After farming the land in Stephenton which he inherited from his f, Festus Rowe sold it to his bro Chauncey in 1829 and headed west. Orson Roe followed the westward trail of many contemporaries some 6 years years after he m and found the need for better land. The first move was to ~~Char-~~ ~~don~~ twp Geauga co Ohio where the family grew and farming improved. The census records suggest that Orson's bro Elizur and perhaps his cousin Russell, joined this migration from Schoharie co NY since they show up as neighbors in Geauga co Ohio in 1840!

Orson moved west again in 1853, some 300 miles by ox team, to the still more fertile land of McHenry co Ill. He and his sons farmed and threshed grain in the northeast area of that co during the pre Civil war years. He d there in 1861.

The family continued farming in McHenry co after Orson d and despite the absence of s Philo with the Federal army during the war. In 1868 the entire family (2 m s) moved west the last time to Mower co Minn where they acquired new land and separate dwellings. Mary Armstrong(?) Roe d there in 1901.

Elizur Roe also migrated to Geauga co Ohio ca 1835; possibly with his bro Orson and cousin Russell as previously suggested. There is no record of parents of this John Roe but his f is believed to have been the missing bro of Heman 6-1.03 and Ansel 6-1.04, other sons of Phineas 5-1.02; all per the 1790 Dutchess co NY census. This hypothesis is based on John Roe having eventually settled with his family, very close to Heman Roe, who would be his uncle; and to Heman's sons, who would be his first cousins; all in the remote and rural Town of Broome Schoharie co NY

While John Roe could have been a grs of one of the other bros of Phineas, for whom no desc are recorded, that is an unlikely supposition. The Roes in Broome would then have been remote cousins, with much less probability of communication leading to "neighbor" settlement.

Silas Roe's occupation was that of "expert" carpenter but very likely his opportunity in Chenango co NY was limited. Following his 2nd m and with prospect

of a large family to support, he migrated westward like so many of his contemporaries. In 1841 he settled on a farm south of Abingdon Knox co Ill.

Some time late in the Civil War period, Silas is reported to have taken a government job. He was in Duval's Bluff Ark, a military supply base, when his w last heard from him ca 1867. He vanished completely thereafter and no record of date or place of death has been found. Many "legends" have been passed down by desc but the present generation agrees that all are without foundation of fact.

There is no word of how Silas' w Mary supported the younger ch after he left since the grown sons were gone too, with only Martin, 12 or 13, remaining to do farm work. She reportedly went back to her original home in Norwich NY late in 1865, but returned to Ill four years later. In June 1872 Silas was declared legally dead by a court in Illinois.

Mary Barber Roe did not remarry and continued to live in Knox co Ill until her death 6 Dec 1915 at StAugustine; almost 101 years of age! She is buried in Hunt Cemetery in Indian Point twp Knox co Ill.

Soon after marrying, Squire Rowe and his bride left Clarkson NY with his f, mo and bro Nelson to settle a virgin land homestead in Highland twp Oakland co Mich. Squire, with his w and mo, traveled the major distance from Buffalo to Detroit via Lake Erie sailing vessel while his f and bro drove a team and wagon, with their household goods, across the Ontario peninsula of Canada.

They cleared the land and built log cabins promptly. Squire Rowe's family occupied their cabin 20 years and all of the ch were b there. In 1855 he built a spacious home of native limestone in which desc have li to the present day. It is a fine specimen of the period's best architecture and has been named "Stone Rowe"

Squire Rowe obviously was an outstanding example of the able and strong principled pioneers who built this country. Eventually he had cleared and cultivated a farm of 200 acres which was very large for that time and area. He was a twp supervisor for 21 years and then was elected Representative to the Michigan legislature. During the Civil War, at age 47, he recruited a company from the area but did not undertake active service.

Squire Washington Rowe d 19 Nov 1866 in Highland Mich at age 51. His w Polly livto the ripe age of 92 and d in Lansing Mich 15 Mar 1909.

When Nelson reached 21 his parents deeded their farm to him but his boyhood adventure from New York to Michigan had given him a taste for more. He journeyed first to Flint Mich and then into Canada where he m the first time. He returned to Highland by 1850 but his w became ill and he took her back to Canada. She d there 11 Oct 1854 after which Nelson journeyed west across the Mississippi River to Missouri where he became interested in logging.

Nelson Rowe's next move was back to Michigan where he bought some good timber land in VanBuren co near Hartford; and married again. Soon thereafter he caught "gold fever" and left his w with infant son to join a California wagon train. He returned after two years but could not resist the lure of California gold and left again in 1857- after siring another son! When he returned home after that adventure, the train was robbed by none other than Jesse James. Nelson, however, had the forethought to toss his bag of gold into a stream before the train stopped and recovered it later.

Nelson Rowe planned one more western trip which was promptly squelched by his long suffering w Ann. What he did for many years after settling down in Hartford is unknown; probably farming. He d there 23 Mar 1907

It is unknown whether Truman Roe preceded his f Orson from Ohio to McHenry co Ill or moved there with the family in 1854. The Civil War broke out when Philo Roe was 25, single, and helping his f (who d that year) and bros farm and thresh grain in NE McHenry co Ill. He enlisted the next year in the 95th Regiment (Co H) of Illinois Volunteer Infantry and fought in the Mississippi river valley campaigns, including Shiloh and the Siege of Vicksburg. He was transferred before the end of the war to the Capitol defense army in Washington and was among those selected to guard Abraham Lincoln's catafalque after that tragic day in April 1865.

Philo returned to the family farm after his army discharge, was m in 1868 and then moved with the rest of the family to Mower co Minn where they settled on separate farms. He returned to McHenry co about 2 years later, however, and purchased a farm near the village of Hartland. Philo raised his family there and prospered until retirement to Woodstock Ill ca 1900.

When Philo Roe d in Woodstock Oct 1923 he was the oldest survivor of his Civil War regiment. His w Emily d there in Feb 1929.

CHAPTER XII

THE TENTH GENERATION

Consideration was given whether to terminate this family record with the 10th generation or to add the 11th. There are now, of course, many descendants of the 11th generation and some of the 12th, on which data are available. It is ended here, however, for the following reasons:

- a. Certainly all Hugh Roe descendants of the 10th generation have now been born so that it is the last to be "complete"; though a majority are missing.
- b. Since some of the 11th and most of the 12th generations are yet to be born, their inclusion would be generally "incomplete".
- c. Only a few of the 11th generation, and surely none of the 12th, would have sufficient interest in Roe/Rowe genealogy to warrant including their records.
- d. The time required to add another generation to this record would not allow it to be completed in 1972 as planned. The potential number of persons almost quadruples with each generation!

Incidentally, it is hoped that the reader will analyze and understand why the author is listed at the very beginning of this 10th generation record. It was a surprise to discover this and is now somewhat embarrassing. With the exception of but 3 missing lines that precede, now estimated as the 52 desc indicated below, it simply happened that the author's ancestors were first sons born in first son's families of each generation, all the way back to Peter (2-0.06) !
