The founder of the family was at New Haven as early as 23 Mar. 1649/50 at which time the birth of his son, Jeseph², was entered in the town books. Whether or not Thomas had removed thence from Lynn, Mass., is conjectural. It is stated in Vol. 5, p. 1650 of "Fimilies of Ancient Hew Haven" that Thomas had been at Lynn but Alense Lewis's "History of Lynn, etc." (1865) does not mention him.

with his guests, and serving wine, tobasco, and liquor not in accordance with regulations. Thomas refused to chait his guilt and stated that one could sing and be serry in Old England and did not see why he couldn't behave in the same faction in Hew Haven. Hewertheless, he was fined so chillings. (HHTMLS5 ff.)

on 2 Mar. 1651/2 Thomas's wife, prosumply Isabelle, his wife in 1657, was judged immount in regards to her having been accused of the terrible crime of trying to fester a marriage between an indentured female servant and another colonist (MITR 1:125).

Home time before 6 Apr. 1652 Thomas and his family removed to Milford, Conn., then under the jurisdiction of the New Haven colony, thither he had removed with out the permission of the authorities (MHTR 1:120).

In Mar. 1652/3 Goodman Langdon was again in cours. In the course of the trial 18 was brought out that he had stolen a pig. which he

His wife was accused as an accessory after the feet but as a witness testified that once Thomas had besten her for refusing to do some work in the fields, it was adjudged that she cated through feer of her husband. He was also convicted of trading powder with the Indians. For these errors he was sentenced to be fined and whipped. (HHTR 1:169 ff.)

In 1654 or the foll. yr. Thomas removed to Derby, Conn., (Orgutt's "Derby, Conn." pp. 18,20,22,35) but did not remain there very long. According to Bunker's "Long Island Genealogies", p. 233, Gilbert Opdyke deeded to Alexander Brian 3 "hollows on the run at East Meadow" in Heapstead, Long Island, which were to be delivered to Thomas Langdon. The deed was dated 16 Sept. 1655. However, the notices in "Records of the Colony and Plantation of New Haven", Vol. 2, pp. 179 & 209, seem to show that Thomas was in Conn. in 1656 and as late as 25 Mar. 1657.

However, nometime during the year 1657 Thomas was a resident of Hr pateal where he remained the rest of his short and occasionally turbulent life (HTR 1:18,36).

Here he pursued the occupations of farmer (HTR 1:34/5) and wolf hunter (P. 67, Schultz's "Colonial Hempstead"). He served as a towns-man in 1660 (HTR 1:71).

Thomas evidently dwelt on the south side of the town (HTR 1:88)

during 1660 and prob. before. In 1662 he purchased a dwelling on

"Stickling's Hock" (HTR 1:210/11) but soon resoved, probably, to "Raynor"

Neck" (HTR 1:223).

Thomas died in the yr. 1663 or 1664 (HTRL:146,159). He possibly left no other descendant than his son, Joseph².

His wife, Isabella, whose maiden name is unknown, possibly survive him and married as her second husband, ----- Osborne, father of Willi Caborne of Hempstead, Long Island.

Ancient How Havon". The basis for it is the record of a suit on the term records of Hempstead which shows that Joseph Langdon secured some sack for his "mother" which William Osborne had promised to pay for (HTR 2:12/13). William Osborne is called "son" of this unnessed lady.

his mother-in-law. As no notice of a sister has come to light, for
Joseph Langdon appears to have been an only child; and as William Osborne
had promised to pay for the sask which seems to point to the likelihood
that the lady was his actual mother (unless he noted out of the kindness
of his heart and decided to buy his "Hother-in-law" sack, an unusual
gesture in any period; or perhaps, he had been instructed by his late
father to take care of his step-mother's needs); and as Isabelle's presumed marriage to an Osborne would almost certainly have taken place in
Hempstead and no notice of an Osborne of a generation before that of
William has come to light; and as Joseph² Langdon had a son named
William has come to the writer that Joseph² married an Osborne,
as the most probable of the three possibilities.

At the trial of Thomas at New Navon in 1652/3, reported above, Edward Woosterof Derby, Conn., was called "Brother" of Thomas. The writer believes that Wooster probably married a sister of Thomas, as his first child (male) was named Thomas Wooster ("Gen. of the Woosters in America").

It might be well to state in concluding the account of the progenitor of the Hempstead family that the news occasionally appeared as Landell, Landon, Langdell(possibly the original name), & Langden.

BROOND GENERATION

Mo.2 Joseph2 (Thos.1)

In 1665 ho, a resident of Hempstead, bought a mure (HTK 1:178).

He married, probably in 1671, May (Osbernot) who was living as late as 1705/6 (HTR 2:475), and who was mother of all his children, doubtless.

In the 1673 census of Hompstead a "John Langd" appears (DHNY 1:658). This doubtless is an error and Joseph is meant.

He was listed as an inhabitant of the same town in 1685 (DHHX 2:523).

Joseph was a farmer. He does not appear to have held any public office.

In 1676 he was fined 10 pounds for his part in the destuction of Mr. Cornell's house (ODNY 14:726).

In 1693 he is found dwelling with his wife, May, and their chil., in one household in Hempstead. The order of the names is that which appears below; his daughter, Morey, however, had married before this date and of course, was dwelling with her husband in 1698. (Não 45159)

In 1705/6 Joseph Langdon, Sr. deeded to his son, John, the former's dwelling and instruments of husbandry, and to his son, Samuel, of the 100 acros lately taken up by his son, Thomas, under a "proprietary" right, and to the "hollows" on the plains. Samuel was swidently single at this time. Provisions were made for the wife of Joseph, herein called "Mary", and their children, Mary Langdon, & Hanneh, Langdon.

John and Sessel also were granted a mendow at Hear Rocksuny on the west side of Hill River and north of the bay and orack, said meadow ser of land of Joseph. (HTR 2:475 ff.)

Juseph2 probably died shortly after the date of the latter grant, 1706.

Joseph 11ved at Huar Rocksway (HPA 8:334). He was prob. a farmer.

His will wan pro. 1739, date not given. As his wife was not mentioned she had probe predecessed him. He mentioned the chil. named below; the sens in the order in which they appear below, especially noting that John was the eldest and Hanuel the youngust son; and the daughters in the order to be given, with the notation that Letitia was to take care of Jerusha, who was under 18. With certain exceptions the writer has arranged the order of birth by taking the names of sons and daughters alternately from the respective lists. The will names Joseph's brother, samuel? Fr. (No.11) and Samuel. (No.36), non of John's (No.10), deceased, exts. (NO.11) and Samuel.

However, Christian³ Gerretse Enedeker and his wife, Pietorje Ariaense, had a daughter, Willemtje, who was bapt. 4 Mar. 1691 at Jamaios; Christian and his family were in Homestead in 1698, Willemtje Enedeker was the only Willemtje in Hempstead in 1698, and John³ and Willemtje Langdon had a daughter, "Petorche", so therefore, the Writer feels safe in presuming that the maiden name of John³ Langdon's wife, was as given. (REC 45:54 ff.; Bergen's "Early Settlers of Kingb Co., A.,

John was a miller (HTR 2:451,491). His will was located near his house on the Hill River at Hear Rockaway. He possibly worked his farm too, which he had been given by his father.

His last willwas dated 1724/5 and pro. 1725. In this doc. he mentioned that he was ill. His wife, Willemtje (liv. 1733 (WW 260)) was given 40 acres north of his orchard, etc. Samuel was called his eldest son, and testator, that four of his children were under 10 yrs. of age. (NYM 21291).

Joseph was a captain in the militia (CER 21498)&(HTR 81445/6,454, 471). He owned a farm in the region of Hempstead known as Near Rockaway (HTR 81445/6,454,471).

Joseph might have been living as late as at 1751 (HTR 4:81/2), He definitely was alive 1742 at least (HTR 8:272).

He recorded a stock mark 1722, later dropped (HTR 2:213) and in 172 another mark, formerly his father's (HTR 2:315/6).

He married 1750 at St. George's Ch., Humpsteud, Elizabeth Bartos ("Adv. for God").

Bouth of the Freebyterian Hesting House in Hempstead (NTR 4:207).

The date of the last notice was 1754. The writer believes that this member of the family died between that date and 1768, for in the latter;

James Langdon, son of a Samuel Langdon, deceased, sold some property and the deed was also signed by Hargaret Ockley (Ockley), at that time wife of John Ockley, but widow of Samuel Langdon (HTR 5:356/8. Also see pp. 135,229,235.). The writer may be in error but he believes this deceased Samuel Identical with Samuel (No.36). Whether Hargaret or Elizabeth (Bartos) Langdon was the mother of James in not known.

Due to the presence of one, and possibly two, of the same name who were his homestead contemporaries, his career is concenhat difficult to determine.

He was prob. the Samuel, Jr. who was dwelling at Rockasay in 1742 (HPR 3:525/5) where he prob. pursued the occupation of farmer.

In 1746 a Hilly Langdon was bapt, at St. George's Ch., Hempstoad, daughter of Samuel and Hary ("Adv. for God"). This Hilly might have been \$6.50, Januater of Samuel, born o. 1750, or a daughter of Samuel, (No.4)

Samuel had probe the same who has elected to the offices of fence. Viewer, pounder, a trustee of Humpstead 1/74-1/33, although he did not hold all three offices every single year (HTM 5:330,460,486,493; 6:9,25, 35).

It is the writer's belief that this search was he who was referred to as "Junior", usually, during the years preseding the death of Samuel? (No.11) in 1753, although he was almost certainly Samuel, 3rd, to be exact.

Besuel (10.44) was probably one of the samuel Langdons who was a Tory during the herolution (REV.PAP. 1:182,184;216; Rev. Incidents of Queens Go., N.T. by Henry Onderdonk, Jr. p.118 ff.)

In the will of Harmen Johnson (Janse), dated 1745, the wife of William Langdon, is called "Cornelia" and her parentage is given as above (NYW 4:94), doubtless the same person.

William was a carpenter (MYM 6:7/8). He prob. dwelt at Near Rockaway.

During the Revolution he was a Tory (REV.PAP. 1:183,216 & p.118 ff. of Onderdonk's "Rev. Incidents of Queens Co., MY.).

Was he the William Langdon of South Hempstead whose will was dated 1785 and pro. 1794 (P.27, Queens County, N.Y.-Abstract of Wills Ms. in L.I. Hist. Soc.)?

William was the father of one daughter and probably one son, and possibly other children. Catherine, his wife, was mother of the daughter whose name is given below and prob. of the son listed here:

No.64 Hilly⁵ Bapt. 1746 as daughter of William and Eatherine Langdon ("Adv. for God"). If her father was he whose will was probated 1794, she evidently a Carman.

Ho.65 William⁵ Born c. 1748. Prob. a Hempstead Tory during the Revolution (P.118 ff. Onderdonk's "Rev. Incidents of Queens Co., N.Y.) Overseer of highways in Hempstead 1776 (HTR 5:486). Prob. he who was resident of Hempstead in 1800 (HEC 54:117).
