The founder of the family was at New Haven as early as 23 Mar. 1649/50 at which time the birth of his son, Joseph², was entered in the town books. Whether or not Thomas had removed thence from Lynn, Mass., is conjectural. It is stated in Vol. 5, p. 1080 of "Families of Ancient New Haven" that Thomas had been at Lynn but Alonso Lewis's "History of Lynn, etc." (1865) does not mention him.

While at New Haven Thomas Langdon was a tavern keeper (SAVAGE), and on 7 Jan. 1650/1 was tried and convicted of providing disorderly entertainment. He was accused of singing "filthy, corrupting songs" with his guests, and serving wine, tobacco, and liquor not in accordance with regulations. Thomas refused to admit his guilt and stated that one could sing and be merry in Old England and did not see why he couldn't behave in the same fashion in New Haven. Nevertheless, he was fined 20 shillings. (NHTR 1:125 ff.)

On 2 Mar. 1651/2 Thomas's wife, presumably Isabelle, his wife in 1657, was judged innocent in regards to her having been accused of the terrible crime of trying to foster a marriage between an indentured female servant and another colonist (NHTR 1:125).

Some time before 6 Apr. 1652 Thomas and his family removed to Milford, Conn., then under the jurisdiction of the New Haven colony, whither he had removed with out the permission of the authorities (NHTR 1:120).

In Mar. 1652/3 Goodman Langdon was again in court. In the course of the trial it was brought out that he had stolen a pig, which he

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denied. His wife was accused as an accessory after the fact but as a witness testified that once Thomas had beaten her for refusing to do some work in the fields, it was adjudged that she acted through fear of her husband. He was also convicted of trading powder with the Indians. For these errors he was sentenced to be fined and whipped. (HTR 1:169 ff.)

In 1654 or the foll. yr. Thomas removed to Derby, Conn., (Orcutt's "Derby, Conn." pp. 18, 20, 22, 25) but did not remain there very long. According to Barker's "Long Island Genealogies", p. 233, Gilbert Opdyke deeded to Alexander Brian 3 "hollows on the run at East Meadow" in Hempstead, Long Island, which were to be delivered to Thomas Lengdon. The deed was dated 16 Sept. 1655. However, the notices in "Records of the Colony and Plantation of New Haven", Vol. 2, pp. 179 & 209, seem to show that Thomas was in Conn. in 1656 and as late as 25 Mar. 1657.

However, sometime during the year 1657 Thomas was a resident of Hempstead where he remained the rest of his short and occasionally turbulent life (HTR 1:18, 36).

Here he pursued the occupations of farmer (HTR 1:34/5) and wolf hunter (p. 67, Schultz's "Colonial Hempstead"). He served as a townsmen in 1660 (HTR 1:71).

Thomas evidently dwelt on the south side of the town (HTR 1:88) during 1660 and prob. before. In 1662 he purchased a dwelling on "Stickling's Neck" (HTR 1:210/11) but soon removed, probably, to "Raynor's Neck" (HTR 1:223).

Thomas died in the yr. 1663 or 1664 (HTR 1:146, 159). He possibly left no other descendant than his son, Joseph².

His wife, Isabelle, whose maiden name is unknown, possibly survived him and married as her second husband, ----- Osborne, father of William Osborne of Hempstead, Long Island.

This supposition is given in Vol. 5, p. 1030 of "Families of Ancient New Haven". The basis for it is the record of a suit on the town records of Hempstead which shows that Joseph Langdon secured some sack for his "mother" which William Osborne had promised to pay for (HTR 2:12/13). William Osborne is called "son" of this unnamed lady.

Two other possibilities suggest themselves. William Osborne might have married a sister of Joseph Langdon and the lady was his mother-in-law; or, Joseph Langdon might have married an Osborne and the lady was his mother-in-law. As no notice of a sister has come to light, for Joseph Langdon appears to have been an only child; and as William Osborne had promised to pay for the sack which seems to point to the likelihood that the lady was his actual mother (unless he acted out of the kindness of his heart and decided to buy his "Mother-in-law" sack, an unusual gesture in any period; or perhaps, he had been instructed by his late father to take care of his step-mother's needs); and as Isabelle's presumed marriage to an Osborne would almost certainly have taken place in Hempstead and no notice of an Osborne of a generation before that of William has come to light; and as Joseph² Langdon had a son named William, all indicate to the writer that Joseph² married an Osborne, as the most probable of the three possibilities.

At the trial of Thomas¹ at New Haven in 1652/3, reported above, Edward Wooster of Derby, Conn., was called "Brother" of Thomas¹. The writer believes that Wooster probably married a sister of Thomas¹, as his first child (male) was named Thomas Wooster ("Gen. of the Woosters in America").

It might be well to state in concluding the account of the progenitor of the Hempstead family that the name occasionally appeared as Landell, Landon, Langdell (possibly the original name), & Langdon.

Child of Thomas¹ Langdon and his wife, Isabelle (----) Langdon:

SECOND GENERATION

No.2 Joseph² (Thos.¹)

In 1665 he, a resident of Hempstead, bought a mare (HTR 1:178).
 He married, probably in 1671, May (Osbornet) who was living as late as 1705/6 (HTR 2:475), and who was mother of all his children, doubtless.

In the 1673 census of Hempstead a "John Langd" appears (DHNY 1:658). This doubtless is an error and Joseph is meant.

He was listed as an inhabitant of the same town in 1683 (DHNY 2:523).

Joseph was a farmer. He does not appear to have held any public office.

In 1676 he was fined 10 pounds for his part in the destruction of Mr. Cornell's house (ODNY 14:726).

In 1698 he is found dwelling with his wife, May, and their chil., in one household in Hempstead. The order of the names is that which appears below; his daughter, Morcy, however, had married before this date and of course, was dwelling with her husband in 1698. (RHO 45:59)

In 1705/6 Joseph² Langdon, sr. deeded to his son, John³, the former's dwelling and instruments of husbandry, and to his son, Samuel³, $\frac{1}{4}$ of the 100 acres lately taken up by his son, Thomas³, under a "proprietary" right, and $\frac{1}{4}$ of the "hollows" on the plains. Samuel was evidently single at this time. Provisions were made for the wife of Joseph², herein called "Mary", and their children, Mary³ Langdon, & Hannah³ Langdon.

John³ and Samuel³ also were granted a meadow at Near Rockaway on the west side of Mill River and north of the bay and creek, said meadow of land of Joseph³. (HTR 2:475 ff.)

Joseph² probably died shortly after the date of the latter grant, 1706.

THIRD GENERATION

No. 3 THOMAS³ (Jos.² Thos.¹)

He prob. married c. 1699, -----, the mother of his chil. whose names appear below. He married, secondly, Mary (----) Alburtus, widow of Arthur Alburtus of Hempstead, 1727 at St. Geo. Ch., Hempstead. (NYW 11:4/3). In 1732 he was living at Jerusalem, L.I.

He was doubtless a farmer. At various times he took up large grants of land (HTR 8:327/8, 346, 425) in the South Woods of Hempstead.

His will, dated 1733 and pro. 1734, mentions wife, Mary, and the following relatives, in this order: (NYW 3:148/9)

He m. c. 1704 Elizabeth, maiden name unknown. She was very likely
mother of all his chil.

William was a miller. His mill was located at Near Rockaway.

(HTR 3197).

His will, date not given, was pro. 1733. In this doc. he mentioned
wife, Elizabeth, son, Solomon, to whom was given all lands, and the
foll. daughters in this order, Elizabeth, Jane, Hannah, Abigail, Phoebe,
Deborah. His sons-in-law, Thomas Foster and John Low (prob. Losses) and
wife, Elizabeth were named exrs. (HTR 31259)

Children of William³ and his w., Elizabeth (----) Langdon:

No.8 JOSEPH³ (Jos.² Thos.¹)

He married firstly, -----, mother of his son, John⁴, b. c. 1700 and possibly two or three others. Joseph³ married secondly, Hannah Garman, 30 May 1715 at Grace Ch., Jamaica (p.281, Orig. and Hist. of Grace Ch., Jamaica N.Y.), who was mother of Hannah⁴, Sarah⁴, & Jerusha⁴; almost certainly mother of Samuel⁴, and quite possibly mother of all the others except John⁴.

Joseph³ lived at Near Rockaway (HRH 8:334). He was prob. a farmer.

His will was pro. 1739, date not given. As his wife was not mentioned she had prob. predeceased him. He mentioned the chil. named below; the sons in the order in which they appear below, especially noting that John was the eldest and Samuel the youngest son; and the daughters in the order to be given, with the notation that Letitia was to take care of Jerusha, who was under 18. With certain exceptions the writer has arranged the order of birth by taking the names of sons and daughters alternately from the respective lists. The will names Joseph's³ brother, Samuel³ Jr. (No.11) and Samuel⁴ (No.36), son of John³ (No.10), deceased, exrs. (NYW 3:232)

No. 10 JOHN³ (Jon.² Thos.¹)

John³ m. c. 1708 Willemtje Snedeker, who was doubtless mother of all his chil. No record of the marriage has been found and only the first name of John's³ wife, appears in his will. However, Christian³ Gerretse Snedeker and his wife, Pieterje Ariensee, had a daughter, Willemtje, who was bapt. 4 Mar. 1691 at Jamaica; Christian and his family were in Hempstead in 1698, Willemtje Snedeker was the only Willemtje in Hempstead in 1698, and John³ and Willemtje Langdon had a daughter, "Peterche", so therefore, the writer feels safe in presuming that the maiden name of John³ Langdon's wife, was as given. (REC 45:54 ff.; Bergen's "Early Settlers of Kings Co., N.Y.")

John was a miller (HTR 2:451, 491). His mill was located near his house on the Mill River at Near Rockaway. He possibly worked his farm too, which he had been given by his father.

His last will was dated 1724/5 and pro. 1725. In this doc. he mentioned that he was ill. His wife, Willemtje (liv. 1733 (WH 260)) was given 40 acres north of his orchard, etc. Samuel was called his eldest son, and testator^{stated} that four of his children were under 10 yrs. of age. (NYN 2:291).

The names of the chil. are taken from the will and the order likewise Children of John³ and Willemtje (Snedeker) Langdon:

He recorded his stock taken on the town books of Hempstead in 1710
(HR 2:145).

He d. c. 1711 Mary -----, The writer believes she might have been
born Mary Raynor, daughter of Samuel & Mary (-----) Raynor of Hempstead
(RAC 45:59/60), as this Mary Raynor had a brother, Ezekiel Raynor, (RAC
45:60), and Mary, wife of Samuel³ Langdon, had a son Ezekiel Langdon,
and Ezekiel Raynor was exec. of the last will of Samuel³ Langdon.

Samuel³ Langdon was doubtless a farmer. He dwelt at Near Rockaway,
Long Island (HR 3:32/6). He often appeared on the records as Samuel, Sr.

His last will was dated 1752 and prob. 1753. He mentioned w., Mary,
sons, Samuel and Ezekiel, to whom he had previously made gifts he said,
and William, in that order, and dau., Mary Oakley, Sarah Bedell,
Phoebe Lodge, and "Mary" Langdon. (HR 4:133/9 and NY Corruptions 1:196)

The order of births of the chil. of Samuel & Mary (Raynor?) Langdon
below may be incorrect:

FOURTH GENERATION

No.13 JOSEPH⁴ (Thos.³ Jon.² Thos.¹)

He was doubtless the Joseph who m. Keziah (-----), whose chil., Joseph & Keziah Langdon were bapt. 9 May. 1736 at St. George's Ch., Hempstead ("Adv. for God"), and very likely the Joseph Langdon who m. Abigail Lee 16 Oct. 1736 at same church ("Adv. for God").

Joseph⁴ was a captain in the militia (GAR 2:498)&(HTR 8:445/6,454,471). He owned a farm in the region of Hempstead known as Near Rockaway (HTR 8:445/6,454,471).

Joseph⁴ might have been living as late as 1751 (HTR 4:81/2). He definitely was alive 1742 at least (HTR 8:2/2).

Children of Capt. Joseph⁴ Langdon and his w. Keziah (---) Langdon, order or time of birth unknown:

No.22 SOLOMON⁴ (William³ Joseph² Thos.¹)

Solomon⁴ m. at St. George's Ch., Hempstead, 1737, Margaret Manwaring ("Adv. for God").

He was a miller and dwelt at Near Rockaway (HTR 3:325/6). Sometime between 1742 and 1753 or 1756 he rem. to Staten Island (HTR 3:325/6;5:460)

NYW Corrections 1:197), where he died 1753(?) intestate, and letters of administration were granted to Thomas Hammerling (NYW Corr. 1:197). As he died 1753, according to the record, and as he sold all his patent right in Hempstead to a cousin in 1756, according to another record, an error was made by some copier, evidently.

He recorded a stock mark on the Hempstead recs. 1727 (HTR 2:276),
a second one 1729? (HTR 2:213).

In 1729 he m. Ann Garman at St. George's Ch., Hempstead ("Adv. for God"). He was living 1733 or so (father's will).

Nothing further is known of him, definitely. In 1755 a John was bapt. at St. George's Ch., Hemp., s. of John, dec., and Katherine Langdon ("Adv. for God."). Was this John, hmb. of Katherine, s. of John⁴ (No. 25

Child of John & Ann (Garman) Langdon)

? No. 55 John⁵ Married Katherine ----- Had son John⁶ bapt. 1755.

This John⁵ might have been son of Samuel⁴ (No. 36).

No. 36 SAMUEL⁴ (John³ Jos.² Thos.¹)

He recorded a stock mark 1722, later dropped (HTR 2:213) and in 172 another mark, formerly his father's (HTR 2:315/6).

He married 1730 at St. George's Ch., Hempstead, Elizabeth Bartoe ("Adv. for God").

Samuel⁴ was a shoemaker (HTR 3:108). His tanyard was some distance south of the Presbyterian Meeting House in Hempstead (HTR 4:207).

The date of the last notice was 1754. The writer believes that this member of the family died between that date and 1760, for in the latter,

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James Langdon, son of a Samuel Langdon, deceased, sold some property and the deed was also signed by Margaret Oakley (Oakley), at that time wife of John Oakley, but widow of Samuel Langdon (HTR 5:256/8. Also see pp. 125, 229, 235.). The writer may be in error but he believes this deceased Samuel identical with Samuel⁴ (No.36), whether Margaret or Elizabeth (Bartoe) Langdon was the mother of James is not known.

Child of Samuel⁴ (No.36) (Also see John⁴ No.25 & Samuel⁴ No.44):
? No.56 James⁵ Doubtless the Hempstead Tory (REV.PAP. 1:182/4).

No.44 SAMUEL⁴ (Samuel³ Joseph² Thomas¹)

Due to the presence of one, and possibly two, of the same name who were his Hempstead contemporaries, his career is somewhat difficult to determine.

He was prob. the Samuel, Jr. who was dwelling at Rockaway in 1742 (HTR 3:325/8) where he prob. pursued the occupation of farmer.

In 1746 a Milly Langdon was bapt. at St. George's Ch., Hempstead, daughter of Samuel and Mary ("Aiv. for God"). This Milly might have been No.50, daughter of Samuel³, born c. 1730, or a daughter of Samuel⁴ (No.4).

Samuel⁴ was prob. the same who was elected to the offices of fence-viewer, pounder, & trustee of Hempstead 1774-1783, although he did not hold all three offices every single year (HTR 5:330, 460, 486, 493; 6:9, 25, 35).

It is the writer's belief that this Samuel was he who was referred to as "Junior", usually, during the years preceding the death of Samuel³ (No.11) in 1753, although he was almost certainly Samuel, 3rd, to be exact.

Samuel⁴ (No.44) was probably one of the Samuel Langdons who was a Tory during the Revolution (REV.PAP. 1:182, 184/216; Rev. Incidents of Queens Co., N.Y. by Henry Onderdonk, Jr. p.118 ff.)

Child of Samuel⁴ and Mary (-----) Langdon:

Also see Samuel⁴ (No.36)

No.46 EZEKIEL⁴ (Samuel³ Joseph² Thomas¹)

Ezekiel married, shortly after 1740 prob., Sarah -----.

He was prob. a farmer (NYW 4:438/9), and prob. dwelt at Near Rockaway like the other members of his family.

He recorded a stock mark in 1754 (HTR 4:424).

In his last will, dated and pro. 1760, he mentioned w., Sarah, three daus., Mary, Elizabeth, & Milly, and three sons, Richard, Archelaus, & Samuel, all of whom were under age. William Langdon, carpenter, witnessed the doc. (NYW 6:7/8).

Children of Ezekiel⁴ and Sarah (----) Langdon: (Order unknown)

No.58 Mary⁵ Prob. m. William Poole of Hempstead (NYW 12:40/41)

No.59 Richard⁵ Prob. the Hempstead Tory (REV.PAP. 1:184; p.118 ff. "Rev. Incidents of Queens Co., N.Y."-Onderdonk)
Recorded a stock mark 1761 (HTR 4:458). Prob. the Richard Langdon residing in Hempstead in 1790 (N.Y. Census) and in 1800 (REG 54:117).

No.60 Elizabeth⁵

No.61 Archelaus⁵ If, as the writer presumes, his name was erroneously printed as Archibald, then he was the Hempstead Tory who voted to send no deputies to the provincial Congress in 1775, etc. (REV.PAP. 1:184,216). Probably the Archelaus who resided in Hempstead in 1790 (N.Y. Census, p. 157) and in 1800 (REG 54:27).

No.62 Milly⁵

No.63 Samuel⁵ Probably a Hempstead Tory (REV.PAP. 1:182,184,216), and he who resided in Hempstead in 1790 (N.Y.Census

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p.157) and in 1800 (REC 54:157).

No.47 WILLIAM⁴ (Samuel³ Joseph² Thomas¹)

William⁴ was a private in Hicken's Co. of Queens Co. Militia in 1738 (QMR 1:576).

He married 1740-45, Catherine⁴ Bedell of Hempstead, dau. of Thomas³ and Mary (---) Bedell (REC 71:369 & Corrections mentioned under Sarah⁴ No.48). In the will of Harmen Johnson (Janse), dated 1745, the wife of William⁴ Langdon, is called "Cornelia" and her parentage is given as above (NYW 4:94), doubtless the same person.

William was a carpenter (NYW 6:7/8). He prob. dwelt at Near Rockaway.

During the Revolution he was a Tory (REV.PAP. 1:183,216 & p.118 ff. of Onderdonk's "Rev. Incidents of Queens Co., NY.).

Was he the William Langdon of South Hempstead whose will was dated 1785 and pro. 1794 (P.27, Queens County, N.Y.-Abstract of Wills Ms. in L.I. Hist. Soc.)? 2025014

William⁴ was the father of one daughter and probably one son, and possibly other children. Catherine, his wife, was mother of the daughter whose name is given below and prob. of the son listed here:
