Sketch of Lloyds Neck.

Lloyds Neck - called by the Indians Camusset, contains about 3000 acres of land, projecting into the Sound between Cold Spring and Huntington.

It was erected into a Manor called Luceen's Village in 1685 during the administration of Governor Dongan.

The purchase of this Neck was made on the 20th of Sept. 1654 from Ratican Sagamore of Cow Harbor - by Samuel Mayo, Daniel Whitehead and Peter Wright, three of the first

settlers of Oyster Bay,
for the price of three coats,
three shirts, two cuttoves
three hatchets, three hoes,
two fathoms of awampun,
six knives, two pairs of
stockings and two pairs
of shoes.

They sold out to Samuel
Andrews on the 6th of May
1658 for £100 and the
sale was confirmed by
Wyandanch, the Long
Island Sachem; on the
14th.

On the death of Andrews,
the Vlack was conveyed
to John Richbill, the 5th
Sept. 1660 who obtained a
confirmation patent from
Governor Nicoll, Dec. 18, 1665.

Rich Hill sold to Nathaniel
Sylvestre, Thomas Hart
and Latimer Sampson,
Oct. 18, 1666 for \$450.

Sylvestre released to his
cotenants Oct. 17, 1668
having first procured an
additional patent from
Governor Uicoll. Nov. 20, 1667
James Lloyd of Boston
having become entitled
to a part of the Weck, a
right of his wife Grizzle
Sylvestre (by devise from
Sampson) obtained a
patent of confirmation
from Governor Andrews
Sept. 1677 and on the 17th
of Oct. 1679 he purchased
of the executors of Hart
his part of the Weck for

of 200, in consequence of
which he became
sole owner, and from
which time the premises
has been called Lloyd's
dock.

Mr Lloyd died Aug. 16,
1693 aged 47 leaving issue
Henry Joseph and Guggle.
His will was probated
Sept. 22, 1693 by which the
dock was devised to
his children in equal
portions.

Henry having purchased
the interests of his
brother and sister
became sole owner and
proprietor and settled
here 1711.

James Lloyd the first
of his family in America,
was a resident of Boston.
He married Gingle
Sylvester of Shelter
Island, we suppose about
1670.

In her right * and
by purchase he became
in 1684 possessor of the
entire Neck, which in
1685 was, by Governor
Dongan, created a Manor.

* Will of Lattimer Sampson
dated 16th Feb. 1668 devises
his part of the Neck to his

retrothred Yingle
Sylvester, of Shelter Island
and quit claim deed
to James Lloyd dated
Feb. 6th 168³/₄.

James Lloyd never resided
on the Neck, but his son
Henry, who was bred
a Merchant in Boston.
Mass. located himself
here in 1711 as sole pro-
prietor and remained
till his death in 1763.
Henry Lloyd married
Rebecca the daughter
of John Nelson of Boston
(she was the great-grand
daughter of Sir John
Temple Kt. of Riddlesden
and Stantonbury Co, Bucks.
and sister of Elizabeth

wife of Robert Temple,
 father of Sir John Temple
 Bt. first British
 representative to this
 country) and has
 viz; Henry, John,
 Margaret, James, Joseph,
 Rebecca, Elizabeth,
 William, Nathaniel
 and James.

He left the Week to
 his four sons, Henry,
 John, Joseph and James.
 When the revolutionary
 war broke out Henry
 declared for the Mother
 Country and removed
 to Nova Scotia.
 John and Joseph went
 to Connecticut and
 James who was a physician

pursued the business of his profession in Boston where he settled early in life, and after the war Henry's estate at the Neck was confiscated, sold, being purchased by John Lloyd Jr. the son of John (at-named).

Joseph had died during the War, and left his part of the neck to John Lloyd Jr. who thus became possessed of the two western estates.

His descendants are at present 1838 possessed of about three fourths of the Neck.

Of the four sons to whom Henry left the

Week, the eldest Henry
married Miss Hutchinson
of Mass. and died in
London Eng. but left
no issue!

The second son John
married Sarah Woolsey
of Dorset L. I. and had
issue Henry, John,
Rebecca, Abigail and
Sarah.

Henry did not marry.
John married Amelia
daughter of Rev. Ebenezer
White of Danbury Conn.
Rebecca married John
Bloome late Lieut.
Governor of New York.

Abigail married Dr
James Cogswell late
of the city of New York.

Sarah married James
Hill house of New Haven
Conn.

The fourth son James
married Miss Cousin
of Boston and had
issue a son and a
daughter. The son
James was long a
member of the Senate
of the United States
and died childless.
The daughter still (1838)
survives in Boston.

A.D. 1683 and died
March 18. A.D. 1763.
