Historical Sketch

On this momentous occasion of the observance, on November 14, 1931, of the one hundredth anniversary of the reorganizing of the Moriches Presbyterian Church, it is difficult for those to whom has fallen the task of making a record of the history of the church to fulfill their desire to make a complete story of the early days that can be handed down to future generations. Much of the earliest days of the church has passed from human knowledge, for the available records of those stirring days are but few, and those who laid the foundations for the many advantages which are enjoyed by the present generation have gone to their eternal reward.

As nearly as can be determined, the history of the Presbyterian church of the Moriches goes back to the year 1748, when the Suffolk Presbytery sent one of its licentiates, C. Nehemiah Freeman, here to preach. For nearly a century private houses were used for worship, for it was not until 1809 that the first church edifice was built. Scarcely any record of the first years of the church can be found, that can give a picture of the struggles which the earnest founders of the church must have encountered. In the early days the services were conducted by "circuit riders" who went from village to village, and the first mentioned services are those held by the Rev. Abnar Reeve, which were generally held in the homes of Zachriah and Hezekish Sanford, and later in the home of Samuel Waters. In 1765, the Rev. David Rose is mentioned as the one who rode the circuit of Westhampton. Moriches and Fireplace (now Brookhaven), and also the Rev. Jonathan Robinson,

The first edifice, which was built in 1809, was 30x26 feet, and was used for several years as a union church by the Presbyterians and by the Congregationalists, who had

Island Presbytery, held in Westhampton in 1831, the Rev. Ezra King and the Rev. Ithamar Pillsbury were appointed to re-organize the Presbyterian Church of the Moriches. The members admitted to the church on November 14, 1831, the date of the re-organization, were Samuel Waters, David Terry, Sarah Terry, Jarius Wines, Jeremiah Culver, Jemima Culver, Josiah Smith, Sally Smith, Abraham Osborn, Eliza Osborn, Nancy F. Havens, Mary Smith and Clarissa Smith.

One of the earliest records which has been found in the search for historical material of the old days is the "Constitution of the Moriches Union Church" which was adopted at a meeting of the inhabitants of the parish on the 11th of February, 1839. This constitution is composed of three articles, as follows:

"Article 1. This house of worthip shall be called the Union Church of Mariches agreeable to the name mentioned in the certificate recorded in the office of the clerk of Suffolk County, constituting the two societies as a

corporate body.

"Article 2. It shall be for the use of the Presbyterian Church of Moriches, organized Nov. 14, 1831, and the Strict Congregational Church, organized December 25. 1817, who have agreed to use it together, and whose rights therein are equal. But if there should be any disagreement between the two societies relative to the occupancy thereof, it shall and may be lawful for one sect to use it one half the time and the other sect the other half of the time; that is, the one may use it one week, and the other the next alternately. And further; if at any time the house shall be unoccupied by either sect whose privilege it shall then be to occupy it; it shall be the privilege of the other sect to use the house for religious purposes in the same manner as in their own time; relinquishing such right to the other party upon notice given of an intention to occupy it, at least one week previous to the time at which possession will be required.

"Article 3. The house and all matters relative thereto shall be governed and under the direction of six trustees elected agreeably to law." The trustees which were elected at that meeting were Josiah Smith, Jarius Wines, James M. Fanning, William Penny, Usher Benjamin and Ita Gregory. Other trustees who served during these early years were Abraham S. Osborn, Joel Reeve, Josiah H. Bishop, John S. Havens and John Terry.

On April 2, 1849 a meeting of the parish was called at which it was voted to incorporate the church which "shall be hereafter known by the name of the Presbyterian Church and Parish of Moriches." Elder Jarius Wines was chairmen of this meeting, and six trustees of the Presbyterian Church were elected consisting of Elihu Hawkins, J. W. Pelletreau, John S. Havens, John P. Terry, Josish H. Bishop and Jacob H. Miller. A certificate of incorporation was made out and signed by Elders Elihu Hawkins and Jarius Wines and witnessed by Usher Bejamin.

At this same meeting a resolution was adopted that the church endervor to build a parsonage, subscrip-

tions to be solicited and the money to be paid in installments in one to five years. At a meeting in February of this year, Capt. Josiah. Smith had offered to give to the parish the farm owned by him, called the Waters place. on the condition that the trustees on the delivery of the deed agree that they would build within a term of three years a house of the value of at least seven hundred dollars to be used as a dwelling for the paster or acting minister. Capt. William Penny, Jacob H. Miller and J. W. Pelletreau were appointed to solicit the subscriptions. The house was built in 1850, and later rebuilt and enlarged. A cemetery under the control of the church members was established in the rear of the farm, which has since been incorporated and is under the control of the Mount Pleasant Cemetery Association. Although many of the earlier members of the church were buried in family graveyards, the first church graveyard still remains on Beachfern Avenue opposite the church.

In the year of 1850, under the leadership of the Rev. Henry M. Parsons, the church made great strides spiritually, and a large number of members were received during that year, thirty-eight being added to the membership roll. During this year the custom of renting the pews was established, the receipts being used to pay the salary of the pastor. This practice was continued for a great many years.

The second church edifice, 40x30 feet, which had been erected in 1839, was greatly enlarged to 56x40 feet in 1861, and the capacity of the church was again increased in 1886 to 56x96 feet when the east and west wings were added. From that time no addition was made to the church until the present year, when the church hall was built, providing ample space for the greatly increased Sunday school, and for other church activities.

In 1861 during the pastorate of the Rev. Augustus Dobson, thirty-three members were added to the Church and again in 1878 one of the largest revivals was held under the Rev. Hamilton B. Helmes, at which time eighty-four were received into membership. During this time the famous evangelist, Ira Sankey, brought Frances Crocby, the blind American sang writer, whose familiar hymns have inspired many, to the local church.

Many of the members of the Church in the early days were residents of East Moriches, and a chapel was established there in 1870, which was enlarged in 1880. Evening services were held alternately for some time in the Church and at the East Moriches Chapel. The East Moriches Presbyterian Church was established in 1902. To Egbert O. Howell, of East Moriches, who was elected collector of the Presbyterian Church in 1881, we are indebted for some reminiscences of the olden days, which will be of interest, not only to the few remaining members of those days, but which will bring to the present generation the variety different conditions under which the work of the church was carried on at that time.

In the early years of the 1850's there were but few families who had spring wagens or covered carriages in which to ride to church, and many of the youths of that day, as well as the older people, trudged along two miles or more to attend church services, many of them twice on Sundays. Previous to the addition to the old church edifice in 1861, there were galleries in the church, and these were often filled with young people, the east gallery being reserved for the girls and the west for the boys.

The East, Center and West sections of the Parish each had their prayer meeting night, the ones in "the school house East" being held on Wednesday nights, and in "the school house West" on Tuesday or Thursday nights. Women living near the school houses brought in their lamps filled with burning fluid, and sometimes tallow candles were used. This was before kerosene oil came into use.

In 1852 George B. Reeve of Mattituck taught a singing school in Elst Moriches, and he introduced the melodeon, the first musical instrument used in the church, George T. Osboro was the player until he went to the California gold mines in 1853, and it is thought that about this time the first choir was organized. Among the early organists of the church were Agnes Topping, Mary Pel Istreau, Gilbert S. Terry, Julia Culver, Mary Ella Howell and John L. Havens.

So far as can be ascertained, only three manuals of the church have been published, containing the names of the early members of the church since its re-organization. The first was published in 1850, the second in 1861, and the third in 1879. The latter contains the list of members from the date of organization, and includes the pioneers who laid the foundations of the church and the village. That the names of these carriest workers may not be lost to posterity, they are included in this history. The Register, published at that time, follows:

Early in the present year of 1931, it became increasingly evident to many members that the continued growth of the Church and Sunday School under the guidance of its pastor and his wife, the Rev. and Mrs. H. C. Cresier, necessitated larger quarters to house the activities of the Sunday School and Church. After several meetings of the Board of Trustees and the Parith, it was decided to erect the addition on the east side of the church which is dedicated at this 100th Application of the church which is dedicated at this 100th Application and for social gatherings, a much enlarged kitchen, with the necessary equipment for the serving of church suppers, and a large basement, 20x30 feet, with the long-needed toilet facilities.

The building committee of the Board of Trustees in charge of the erection of the new addition were Mr. C. E. Robinson, chairman, Mr. Joseph A. Titmus and Mr. Gilbert Loper. The Ladies' Guild presented the Church with a new electric hot water heater, and eight dozen chairs for the new auditorium. Several other gifts of equipment have been made for the new hall, including a coffee urn for the kitchen from Mr. and Mrs. Joseph A. Titmus, a cabinet stand for the urn from Mr. Thomas H. Eyton, a pisco from Mr. George Herrmann, Sr., and a steam table for the kitchen, a gift from some of the men of the church. Over one hundred chairs were donated by Mr. Gilbert Loper.

Several representatives of the various organizations were called begether to plan for the three-day observance of the 100th Anniversary at the parsonage early in September of this year. An organization was formed, with Mr. James T. McLein, chairman; Mrs. Oskar Frowein, corresponding secretary; Miss Emma M. Smith, recording secretary; Mrs. H. C. Crosier, treasurer; and Mrs. Florence Chichester and Mr. Carl W. Hyland, historians. The Rev. H. C. Crosier, and the Elders, Mr. F. F. Penney, Mr. H. I. Tarry, Mr. J. H. Carter, Mr. B. Frank MacGregor, Mr. T. Sidney Homan and Mr. Joseph A. Titmus, were elected a committee to arrange for the religious observance on Saturday evening, Novermber 14th. Mr. Joseph A. Titmus and Mr. Gilbert H. Loper were appointed co-chairmen of the committee to arrange for the men's supper to be held on Thursday evening, November 12th, the opening night of the celebration, and Mr. B. Frank MacGregor was appointed tressurer for this affair. Mrs. H. C. Crosier was appointed to have general charge of all arrangements for the three rights. Mr. J. S .Robert, chairman of the Board of Trustess, was appointed chairman of the Reception committee. The following committee was appointed by Mrs. H. C. Crosier to take charge of the children's enterteinment on Friday evening, November 13th; Mrs. Carl W. Hyland, chairman and costumer, assisted by Mrs. Joseph A. Titmus, Mrs. E. Russell Carlile, Mrs. Harold Harrison, Mrs. Dalores Russell, Mrs. Ralph G. Lukert, Miss Cotharine Brooks, Miss Emma Smith, Mr. James T. McLain and Mr. Carl W. Hyland.

In this task of compiling a short sketch of the history of the Moriches Presbyterian Church, your committee has taken much pleasure, and a perusal of the few, scanky records available has given us a brief glimpse of the early days which we hope may be passed on to the reader. It has also prompted the suggestion that the records of the delays of today, so commonplace to us, may be kept so that when the 200th Anniversary rolls around, the future historians may be able to occurs a true picture of the progress that will be made in the extension of the work of God's kingdom in the intervening time.



HISTORICAL SKETCH

The title to the land on which the extended village of Moriches is built was gained by three different patents. That lying between the Mastic River and the creek Senex was included in Smith's first patent; that between Senex and the mill stream, called Barnes' Mill Pond (formerly Terrill's River) was included in Smith's second patent; and that east of the latter point was covered by the patent given for land purchased by Messrs. Taylor, Townsend, and Willets, commonly known as Moriches patentship. During the first years of the 18th century the neck of land lying on the west of the mill stream was called Warratta, and was in possession of Samuel Terrill. The mill stream was named in his honor by the Indians called Paquatuck, and the land on the east of it was called Moriches or Maritches. To keep on friendly terms with the Indians, Chief John Mayhew was also paid "a competent sum of money for the land."

Settlement was begun here at a very early date, probably in the early part of the 18th century. The Moriches did not become a part of the town of Brookhaven until about the time of the Revolution.

The earliest English-speaking ministers on Long Island were undoubtedly Presbyterian in doctrine. The year 1716 witnessed the formation of the Presbytery of Long Island, which included in its territory not only all of Long Island, but New York City as well. It was difficult for Presbytery in those early days to induce its churches to elect ruling elders, or ministers assistants, as they were then often called. It was even more difficult to persuade them to keep records and submit them from time to time for presbyterial review. This accounts for our scanty knowledge of these early days.

Because of the increasing number of Presbyterian Churches on Long Island the Presbytery of Suffolk County was organized in April 1747. At its meeting the following year, October the 20th, 1748, this Presbytery licensed Nehemiah Greenman, a graduate of Yale, and directed him to preach throughout 25 miles of the south side of Long Island, from Quogue to Mastic, as a Probationer, until further orders. This he immediately began to do, so the year 1748 marks the founding of our Center Moriches Presbyterian Church.

One year later, on Nov. 14, 1749, Nathaniel Woodhull, Richard Woodhull, William Smith, John Brewster, and Barnabas Ryder appeared before the Presbytery in behalf of the people of Mastick, Fireplace (Brookhaven), the Moriches, etc. In the result the Presbytery

released Greenman from his appointment at Moriches.

The next mentioned preacher was Abner Reeve, of Southold, who began his labors in 1754. On June 4th, 1755, the parishes of Moriches and Ketchabonock (Westhampton Beach), by their committee (John Brewster and John Jessup) laid before the Presbytery their desire to ordain and install Mr. Reeve as pastor. However, no action was taken at that meeting. The request was renewed at the next meeting in September and accordingly, Presbytery agreed to meet at Moriches on November 4th, 1755, to formally organize a church there and to ordain and install Abner Reeve as pastor. Mr. Reeve was ordained Nov. 5th and the church was organized the next day. So November 6th, 1755, marks the date of the organization of this church. Both Westhampton and Brookhaven were considered parts of this parish.

On October 27, 1761, the eastern part of the parish made complaint to Presbytery of Mr. Reeve's having "fallen foully into the awful sin of drunkenness, and requested his dismissal." Reeve fully acknowledged his shortcomings. His confession was reduced to writing and ordered to be publicly read in all the churches and congregations under the care of Presbytery. But it was not until 1763 that the pastoral relations were dissolved. Shortly after this Westhampton appears as a separate congregation and Moriches is now

associated with Brookhaven.

In 1765, the Rev. David Rose became minister of the church, to continue in this capacity until his death in 1799, with the exception of the years when the Revolution was taking place. For those seven "burdensome and ruinous" years British troops held the churches on Long Island captive, churches were demolished and public worship was very largely suspended. Pastors and other prominent men were driven away. Presbytery did not meet. It required a generation after peace came to "restore order, industry, virtue and prosperty."

The Rev. Jonathan Robinson is mentioned as a supply in 1775.

During all these years the congregation had been meeting in private homes and the school house, having no building of its own. After the death of Mr. Rose in 1799 the Presbyterian element seems

to have died out and lost its identity for several years.

The first church erected here, "the Union Meeting House," was built in 1809. The Church Building subscription list is indeed an interesting document.

"Moriches, January 31, 1809

We the subscribers Do Promis to pay the Several Sums affixed to our names for the Purpose of Building a Decent Meeting House the Denominations of which is thirty-one feet in length and twenty in Breth.

The said Meeting house the Contributions on which we the Subscribers Do build the above Meeting is that it shall be a free house that is to say that any of the proprietors May invite any Preacher of any Denomination to Preach in the Meeting house Property Authorized and in Regular Sanding with the Churches of Suffolk County.

The Church was used by the different denominations which were then struggling for an existance.

The remaining history of the Moriches Presbyterian Church has been so well told in the History published at the Centennial of the Reorganization, Nov. 14, 1931, during the pastorate of the Rev. Herbert C. Crosier, that there is need here only to sketch the main facts. A copy of the 1931 Year Book will be sent free on request.

- 1817, Dec. 25—Organization of the Strict Congregational Church.
- 1831, Nov. 14—Reorganization of the Moriches Presbyterian Church.
- 1834—Organization of the Moriches M. E. Church; Church building 1839.

- 1849, April 2—Presbyterian Church and Parish of Moriches incorporated. Congregational Church became extinct.
- 1861-Church enlarged to 56 by 40 feet.
- 1886-Church again enlarged to 56 by 96 feet.
- 1902—East Moriches Presbyterian Church established.
- 1931-Recreation Hall built.
 - Nov. 14—Splendid three day celebration of Centennial of Reorganization.

The Rev. Herbert C. Crosier brought his very successful pastorate to a close in 1933, being compelled to resign on account of poor health.

The Rev. Robert Shoote began his pastorate on September 20th, 1933. After a year's faithful and conscientious service, his health, too, broke and during the last six months of his ministry, he was forced, on account of sickness, to take intervals of rest from his Pulpit and Pastoral duties. His resignation took effect April 30, 1935 and he entered into Life two days later, May 2.

At a meeting of Long Island Presbytery Sept. 15, 1936, the Rev. Archibald Blue, of Remsenburg, presented a tribute which was adopted by Presbytery. Following are extracts from this Memorial: "When Robert Shoote came to the Center Moriches Presbyterian Church, his robust bodily health and vigorous mind gave strong evidence that his Ministry there would be of long duration and usefulness to the Church he was called to." "In the pulpit and pastoral work Robert Shoote's presentation of Jesus and His message had always the wooing note. His ministry though short was full of service. He made his impress on the lives of the many within the Congregation who recognized the rich quality of his cultured and serious mind."

The Rev. S. Hall Barrett, Jr., assumed his duties as minister of the church August 11, 1935. During the year just passed 34 new members have been added to the church roll.

As a people we have had 188 years of faithful service for the Master. Now we look toward the future with high hopes, "reaching forth unto those things which are before, we press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus."

In our church, elders, who compose the Session of the Church, are elected for life. The dates given above are the dates of such selection by vote of the congregation.

DUTIES OF THE SESSION: "To receive members into the church; to concert the best measures for promoting the spiritual interests of the congregation; to supervise the Sabbath School and the various societies or agencies of the congregation; to appoint delegates to the higher judicatories of the church; to have and exercise exclusive authority over the worship of the congregation, including the musical service; to determine the times and places of preaching the Word and all other religious services; have exclusive authority over the uses to which the church buildings may be put." (Manuel of Presbyterian Law, page 50)

DUTIES OF ELDERS: "Be present at every meeting of the Session of which they are members, unless unavoidably prevented. They should also be prompt in their attendance. Differences should never be permitted to influence the relations of the members of Session one to another. The cares and burdens of the pastor of a church are numerous and wearing. The elders are his divinely appointed helpers in his arduous labors. They should cheerfully respond to his requests for assistance in the work of visitation, the conduct of devotional services, the oversight of church members, the training of the young, and in the detail of administration. However they may differ from him as to matters of policy, they should never permit these differences to interfere with cordiality of fellowship or develop into obstacles in the way of his success. Elders should invariably give active support to the pastor in all his labors. The elders of a congregation should be present at every Church service, unless sickness prevent. Church officers should be examples to the flock, in their fidelity to the obligation resting upon all Christians of regular attendance upon the stated worship of Almighty God. Elders are to endeavor in their private as well as in their public lives to be examples to 'the belivers, in word, in conversation, in charity, in spirit, in faith, in purity.' Elders can by the power of example influence many persons to faith in Christ, encourage weak Christians in their efforts to follow the Saviour, and promote effectively the interests of the Congregation. Visitation of the sick and afflicted is their duty. Elders should by every means possible bring themselves into sympathetic relationship with the young of their churches."—(Manual of Presbyterian Law, pages 290-293.)
