

## **Old Burying Ground - Sag Harbor Circa 1767 aka Old Whaler's Presbyterian Churchyard**

Book V, Records of East Hampton, gives the ancient necrology records of the town. Quite recently a complete list of burials in Old Cemetery at Sag Harbor, compiled in 1885, was located, made by the late William Wallace Tooker, historian, of the Sag Harbor district of East Hampton town. The old Burying Ground, next to the Presbyterian Church, was opened in 1767; the last burial there was made in 1886. In 1840, a new burying ground, Oakland Cemetery, was opened at Sag Harbor. At that time and thereafter many bodies and tombstones were removed from Old Burying Ground to Oakland Cemetery.

The village of Sag Harbor is partly in East Hampton town, and for more than 100 years the old Burying Ground, from 1767 to 1886, served as sepulture for the dead both of East Hampton and Southampton towns who had resided until their demise at "the Port." The old gravestone are crumbling away and many inscriptions on tombs cannot now be read. As no other record exists, it has been thought expedient to preserve a record in this volume to cover the mortality tables in that part of East Hampton in the years when the old graveyard was used. It has been impossible to separate the residents of East Hampton from residents of Southampton in tables; but family names will have much to do in tracing the East Hampton people of the period. Old Burial Ground is but a stone's throw from Division street, which is the dividing line in Sag Harbor between the towns of East Hampton and Southampton.

The key to the following table of mortality is:

OBG means buried in Old Burying Ground.

OC means body or tombstone removed from Old Burying Ground to Oakland Cemetery.

### Note on Captain Hand

The monument erected to the memory of the first person buried in this yard is still standing, and the inscription reads thus:—

"In memory of James, son of James and Lucretia Howell, who died June 4, 1707,  $\text{Æ}$ . one year, 3 months, 18 days."

An aged sister of this child, living until lately, often said that she remembered her mother weeping bitterly because her little brother was buried "way out in those lonesome woods." For this graveyard, the second in use here, was then outside of the village, and in a piece of woods; it is now in the very heart of the place.

The most remarkable thing, however, in this graveyard, is the *series* of monuments illustrating "the connubial felicity" of Capt. David Hand, who had *five* wives. There they stand, "all in a row," all of the same material (save the last wife's monument, which is of white marble), and of the same size and general appearance. Here follow their names as I transcribed them in my note-book: Susannah, died 1791, aged 27; Mary, died 1794, aged 32; Hannah, died 1798, aged 30. At her death the Captain's grief seems to have found relief in the following remarkable inscription on her gravestone:—

"Behold, ye living mortals passing by,  
How thick the partners of one husband lie;  
Vast and unsearchable the ways of God,  
Just, but severe, is his chastening rod."

One would naturally suppose that a husband who considered three wives as a "chastening rod," and who thus affectionately alludes to them as a "just and severe" manifestation of the "unsearchable ways of God," would have been content, if not absolutely anxious, to pass the remainder of his life in single blessedness. Not so, however, for the bereaved gentleman was again married to Charlotte, who died 1800, aged 30, and Hannah, who died 1835, aged 69. "Last of all," in the words of Scripture, "*the man* died also," in 1840, aged 81; and, like those of old, we are tempted to inquire, "At the resurrection whose husband shall he be?" Tradition even says that this Sag-Harbor Bluebeard *proposed* to another lady, who declined the honor of being his *sixth* wife.
