THE NAME is spelled both "Field" and "Fields" in East Hampton Town records. While not a numerous family, nor one with large landholdings, it is an old name here. The "List of East Hampton" for 1675 includes John Field. This list estimates the cash holdings of every householder. John Field was not in the upper brackets, but not in the lowest either. Fields have served from East Hampton, in the Revolution, in the Civil War, in World Wars I and II; and they have sailed out of Sag Harbor on whaling vessels.

Mrs. Abigail Edwards Field, widow of Herbert Stone Field, has given the writer many Field family notes. She thinks that the James Field who sailed from England to Massachusetts Bay Colony, arriving in the spring of 1621, was probably father of the first Field in East Hampton.

Dr. Frederick A. Finch has given much information on the Fields. But he begins with a John Field or Fields who married in 1722. That John could not have been the first Field in E.H., for the John of 1675 was a man of property here. So it seems best to begin with:

JOHN FIELD 1—an adult, tending cattle at Montauk 1672; he is mentioned again in 1703.

JOHN 2—who m. Susanna Smith July 24, 1722 and d. by 1770. Susanna d. Feb. 4, 1771. Ch. John 3, b. 1723, Jane 3 b. 1733 d. 1810, (who m. Jeremiah Bennett of Three Mile Harbor).

JOHN 3* b. 1723, d. by 1767, m. 1749 Elizabeth, dau. John and Hannah Rose Filer, she b. 1728 d. after 1797. Ch. Jerusha 4 b. Nov. 5, 1749, John 4 b. 1754, d. 1794, James 4 b. 1756 and perhaps others.

*In E.H. Trustees Records, 1725–1772, John Field is given permission, 1745, to clear 3 acres for planting grain; adjoining the piece "he cleared lately" on N.W. side of the "path that goeth to Three Mile Harbor." Whether this was John 3 or his father John 2 we do not know. Elizabeth Filer Field, widow of John 3, had her old house repaired 1797 by order of the Town Trustees, William Mulford doing the work.

This family may have included a Henry Field who married Hannah Tuthill Aug. 26, 1784, perhaps a Sylvanus Field mentioned 1816 in a Dominy account book; and perhaps a Samuel Field, who died before 1827; there was a Samuel Field of that period, for his widow, on Nov. 9, 1827, was furnished by the Trustees with a load of wood, "to be carted from the sand hill fence which is now wasting." All widows were the special care of the Town Trustees in our early days; sometimes it was a cow, or pasture privileges,—whatever essential she needed was supplied in a neighborly way.

JOHN 4 (s. of John 3, 2, 1) b. 1754 d. 1794 on a whaleship in Delagoa Bay, Portuguese East Africa, opposite Madagascar, of fever. He m. Sarah Bennett, 1776; his widow d. 1837. According to Dr. Finch's notes, they had no ch.; this John was listed in the E.H. Census of 1776. But Mrs. Herbert S. Field is not sure

whether it was this John who was ancestor of her husband, or his brother James 4; but the family knew about the death and burial of John Field 4; Norindine Field 6th gen. went whaling, during one of his voyages his ship put ashore for water and he saw the grave of John Field at Delagoa Bay.

JAMES 4* (s. of John 3, 2, 1) of Three Mile Harbor, b. 1756 was still living in 1795; he m. Polly, dau. Zebulon and Sarah Miller Bennett, she b. 1756 d. Sept. 9, 1834; ch. Sarah 5 b. 1777 (who m. Jan. 25, 1793, Barzilla King), Samuel 5 b. Dec. 15, 1785, d. Aug. 23, 1850; Huldah 5 (who m. Nathaniel Lester), Sylvester 5 b. 1787 d. Feb. 12, 1869; and perhaps others.

*James 4 served in the Revolution from here, in the Battle of L.I. and in Connecticut; he was a signer of the "Association" in 1775.

According to Mrs. Herbert S. Field, this James Field sailed with Stephen Decatur on the "Gamecock", and was also with Decatur during the war with Tripoli. She says that he "was one of several men, under the daring leadership of Decatur, who blew up under cover of darkness the American frigate Philadelphia, which had been captured by the pirates."

JOHN 5 (s. of John 4 or James 4) lived in Amagansett; birth and death dates unknown; he m. Lydia, dau. Samuel and Lydia Decatur* Bennett; ch. John Decatur 6 b. 1828 d. 1902, who rem. to Huntington, L.I.; Norindine 6 b. 1828 d. 1902; Samuel Bennett 6 b. April 6, 1834 d. Jan. 20, 1910; Sarah 6 (who m. Luther Sherman of Sag Harbor), Mary 6 (who m. 1st Samuel Miller, 8th gen., of East Side, Amagansett; and m. 2nd. a Parmenter of Sag Harbor;) Phebe 6 (who m. John Cook and rem. to Illinois).

*Lydia Decatur came from Ticonderoga, N.Y. and was said to be closely related to Stephen Decatur, hero of the War of 1812; she had flaming red hair, so family tradition says, and that has been handed down in the Field family to this day.

SAMUEL 5 (s. of James 4, John 3, 2, 1) b. Dec. 15, 1785, d. Aug. 23, 1850 m. Mary King, she b. 1789 d. May 18, 1868. Whether there were ch. or not is unknown.

SYLVESTER 5* (s. of James 4, John 3, 2, 1) b. 1787 d. Feb. 12, 1869, lived at Three Mile Harbor, in a small house still standing; he m. Mary E. Anderson of Groton, Conn. who d. May 1, 1874 ae 88; ch. Amanda 6 (who m. Lewis Bennett of East Side and d.s.p.), Dora 6 (who rem. to Conn.); Mary 6 (who m. Sylvester Richardson of Northwest and had ch. William Sylvester and 2 daus.), Esther 6 (who m. John Dutcher and rem. to North Carolina), Sylvester James A. 6, who d. unmd. at sea; Zebulon 6 b. 1831, d. unmd. Jan. 19, 1906.

*This family was notable for piety, religious services were held at their house on Sunday mornings; they walked to Beecher Bennett's for Sunday afternoon services, then walked to The Springs for evening meeting. "Uncle Zebulon" is still remembered here as a gentle old soul in a fringed shawl who walked to the village from Three Mile Harbor with a carpetbag full of herbs and roots. His brother, Sylvester James A. Field, (that was his full name according to a paper found 1933 in the old house by Frank M. Miller) was a whaleman who concluded a voyage on the ship "Gem" in 1842; she went down in 1848 but "Jim" Field did not go down with her. He sailed 1849 on the "Sabina" for the California gold fields and was there in 1850; he sailed boatsteerer on the "Ocean" with Capt. James Hamilton from Sag Harbor Aug. 10, 1866; she was never heard from again after leaving sight of land.

NORINDINE C. 6 (s. of John 5) b. 1828 d. 1902, m. 1st. Rhuemma Eldredge, dau. Lion and Polly Eldredge Loper of Amagansett, she b. 1831 d. March 21, 1870; he m. 2nd. Nov. 22, 1873 Elizabeth Jane Williams, b. in Cornwall, England; she d. Nov. 6, 1909 ae 86. Ch. by 1st m.: Georgianna 7 who d.s.p.; Cordelia Rhuemma 7 (who m. William, s. of Orlando King), John 7 b. July 31, 1857, Anthony Wayne 7 b. July 12, 1863, Angeline 7 (who m. Elmer Robart of

N.J.), Justin G. 7 who d.s.p. Aug. 1894 in the wreck of the steamer Panther off Southampton. Ch. by 2nd. m. Cora E. 7 (who m. William B. Jones, b. in Eng-

land; they rem. to New York).

SAMUEL BENNETT 6 (s. of John 5) b. April 6, 1834, d. Jan. 20, 1910, was married three times and had seven children by each marriage, according to his grandson Harvey Field. Samuel B. Field was a deep-sea whaleman who also whaled off the coast here in later years. He served in the Civil War, in 1st N.Y. Light Artillery. The name of one wife is unknown; family tradition says that he had seven children by a wife in Pennsylvania and all died in an epidemic. He married, probably first, Matilda, dau. Benjamin N. and Phebe Miller Lester and had ch.: Brooks 7, Osmer 7, Lydia 7, Charles 7, George 7, (who m. Grace Gordon of Patchogue, L.I.), Frank 7, and Carrie 7 (who m. Nelson Edwards of Bridgehampton). Only one of these is said to be living, 1952,—Charles 7, of Liberty, N.Y. Samuel B. Field m. 3d. after the death of his 2nd. w., Florence, dau. Jonathan and Emeline Shepard Edwards of Amagansett; she b. June 20, 1857, d. June 24, 1934; their ch.: Samuel Edwards 7 of E.H., b. at The Springs Jan. 3, 1879, d. Sept. 3, 1947; Harry Willis 7 b. Sept. 3, 1882 d. June 6, 1949; Floyd S. 7 b. April 16, 1887; Florence C. 7 b. Aug. 8, 1892 (who m. John Collins of E.H. and had ch: Florence Margaret b. Feb. 3, 1916 who m. Charles Wade of Sag Harbor and had dau. Margaret Lynn b. Nov. 4, 1948; Cecilia Adele b. July 19, 1920 who m. Aulton Haney of Arkansas and had s. John Aulton b. July 26, 1946); Walter N. 7 b. Oct. 3, 1895, d.y.; a ch. d. inf.; perhaps another.

JOHN BENJAMIN 7 (s. of Norindine 6) b. July 31, 1857 m. Caroline Tuen of White Rock, R.I.; (adopted dau. William and Penelope Sears) ch. John Benja-

ANTHONY WAYNE 7 b. July 12, 1863, m. Sept. 14, 1888 Etta Idella, dau. David and Sarah Jane Stone Wilson of West Greenwich, R.I.; she b. March 26, 1872; ch. Bertha Wilson 8 b. April 18, 1890 (who m. Eric Gladd Patterson of New York City); Rhuemma Angeline 8 b. March 29, 1892 (who m. George Hurd Young of New York City); David Norindine 8 b. Aug. 25, 1894 d. Feb. 20, 1918; Anthony Wayne 8 b. Isabelle Mulford 8 b. May 19, 1898, Helen Glorianna 8 b. Aug. 23, 1901, d. March 10, 1910; Gerald Edwards 8 b. May 10,

1905, Sidney Matthew 8 b. Sept. 9, 1915.

HARRY WORDEN 7 of Three Mile Harbor (s. of Samuel Bennett 6) b. Sept. 3, 1882, d. June 6, 1949, m. 1st Anna Bennett she b. 1877 d. 1923 and had s. Harvey Willis 8 b. April 16, 1910; he m. 2nd. Aug. 4, 1923, Dorothy, dau. Isaac and Tassie Baker Bennett; ch. Helen Anna 8 b. 1924 who m. Patrick Paris; Harry W. 8 b. April 9, 1940. The widow of Harry Field 7 m. 2nd., Nov. 18, 1950, Elmer Collins.

FLOYD S. 7 (s. of Samuel B. 6) b. April 16, 1887, m. Anna Rita MacGarva; ch. Elizabeth Mary 8 b. April 12, 1917 (who m. Aug. 1937 Vernon Clyde Horr of

Verona, N.Y. and has ch. Patricia and Dannell).

JOHN BENJAMIN 8 (s. of John Benjamin 7, Norindine 6) b. 1882, rem. to New London, Conn. He m. Icydell Gertrude, dau. David and Effie Jane King Hulse of The Springs; ch. Russell 9 b. May 21, 1904, William 9 b. 1906, Stella 9 b. 1908 (who m. Raymond F. Crandall of The Springs), Wesley 9 who d.y. 1910, Marion Effie 9 b. 1912 (who m. 1st George Dewey Bushman and m. 2nd. Frank T. Bennett of E.H.), Icydell 9 b. 1914 (who m. Raymond Miller); Joseph 9 b. 1919; Gertrude Hulse Field m. 2nd George B. Loper.

- *During the hurricane Herbert Field, his two brothers-in-law, Gilbert and Samuel Edwards, and a neighbor, Vivian Smith, were lost in Block Island Sound. Samuel Edwards was skipper of his fishing boat; he died of exhaustion and exposure, and drifted ashore on Block Island. Herbert, Gilbert, and Vivian were in the cabin when the boat sank on a submerged rocky bar just offshore.

THE SAG HARBOR-WAINSCOTT FIELDS

This family and the East Hampton Field or Fields family are not related, as far as we know, unless they began together in America, back in the first half of the 17th century. Mrs. Annie Austin and Mrs. Minnie Conklin of E.H., Mrs. Ernest Field and Miss Elizabeth Field of Wainscott had heard that their family came originally from Pittsfield, Mass., and the first in this township was Zachariah. John J. Fitzgerald, City Clerk and Treasurer of Pittsfield wrote, Oct. 14, 1952: "Our earliest book of vital statistics records: 1837, Jany. 11 Mr. Zachariah Field Died Aged 78 Years. That is the entire record and there is no information given concerning his parents or other members of the family."

The Zachariah Field who settled in Sag Harbor was either the same who died in Pittsfield, 1837, or son of that one; more likely, the son. The

line follows, as well as we can make it out:

John Chester of Sag Harbor), Sylvester 2 a seafaring man; Mrs. Annie Field Austin had a shell basket her Uncle Sylvester brought home: he d. ae 41. WILLIAM 2* (s. of Zachariah 1) of Sag Harbor m. May 13, 1848 Mary, dau. Wilson B. and Sally Miranda Field King; ch. Ella Van 3 (who m. John C. King of E.H., no ch.), William 3 (who m. a girl from Rhode Island and rem.), Benjamin 3 (who m. Phoebe — from R.I. and rem., no ch.), Zachariah 3 of E.H.; William 3, Sylvester 3, Mary 3 (who m. 1st Ellsworth Sears and had s. Francis Andrew, b. abt. 1887; and m. 2nd. George Sears and had s. George b. Dec. 21, 1892 who m. Lena Elizabeth Young and has ch.: William A. b. 1921 who m. Clover Jellis; Mary Jane b. 1922 who m. Franklin L. Thomas; home Montauk;) Belle 3 (who m. George Morse of Conn.).

*William Field, dockmaster at Sag Harbor, was a very large man known as a stern disciplinarian; but when he swung inside his white picket fence on Ackerly St. his tiny wife reminded him: "William Field, you're not down on the docks now. Mary Field isn't afraid of you!" Their grandson George Field now lives in the old home.

*George Field was bound out at the age of 7 to his cousin Henry Tillinghast of E.H., and was a lifelong member of the Presbyterian Church in E.H.; as long as his Aunt Mary Tillinghast lived he would walk from Wainscott once a year, go to church, and spend the afternoon with her. He went to sea in his youth; and later worked as a farmer in Sagaponack for Huntting Hedges and Wilkes Hedges, living in Wainscott.

CHARLES 2 (s. of Zachariah 1) rem. to Staten Island, N.Y. where he was Captain of a Coast Guard tender, delivering supplies to lighthouses. He m. and had ch. Charles, Emily, Evie, and Sylvester.

EDWARD 2 (s. of Zachariah 1) m. Sarah Sherwood of Sag Harbor; dau. Edith 3

(who m. George Reney; no ch.).

JOHN 2 (s. of Zachariah 1) m. Catherine Shaw of Sag Harbor; ch. John 3 who d.y.; Susan 3 who d. unmd.; Carrie 3 (who m. William Beebe of Sag Harbor and had 3 ch.).

THEODORE 2 (s. of Zachariah 1) m. 1st Mary Godbee who d.; he m. 2nd. Bertha ———— from Moriches, L.I.; ch. d.y.

ZACHARIAH 3 (s. of William 2, Zachariah 1) lived in E.H.; he m. Augusta La Guire of Sag Harbor; ch. Frank 4 (who m. and had s. Frank 5).

WILSON 3 (s. of William 2, Zachariah 1) m. Blanche, dau. William Jackson Bennett of Noyac; ch. George 4, William 4, Ellsworth 4, Raymond 4.

SYLVESTER 3 (s. of William 2, Zachariah 1) m. Charlotte Myers of Sag Harbor; dau. Hazel 4.
