THE KING family is a very numerous one that has served this country with distinction in the past, and is still doing so according to the current "Who's Who in America" which lists no less than 69 by that name. There are Kings all over this republic. Some genealogists give John King of Kent, who came to Boston and married 1714, Sarah Allen, and married second Sarah, daughter of Benjamin Stowell, and had a son Richard born in Boston 1718 as progenitor of all the American Kings; but they were on Long Island before that.

In East Hampton, the King family first settled on the shore front, at Three Mile Harbor and The Springs; one section of the latter village is called "Kingstown", and there is a King's Point at Fire Place and an old well said to be at the site of the first King residence. They have followed the water, both as fishermen off the shore here, and as whalemen in deep-

sea whaling days.

The King family of East Hampton has not been so difficult to trace as some because King parents showed more inventiveness in given names for their offspring. They did not run to plain Janes and Johns generation after generation, a custom which proved extremely confusing in some of the other families. Some King babies' names, especially in the 19th cen-

tury, have been real flights of fancy.

King was not one of East Hampton's earliest names, but the family came to Southold, L.I. not long after that town's settlement. Daughters in the King family of Southold and Oyster Ponds (later called Orient) married early into East Hampton families. Mary King, 3d generation, married in 1691 John Gardiner, proprietor of Gardiner's Island. Her sister Dorothy took for her second husband 1705, Samuel, son of Robert Dayton of East Hampton. Their brother, Capt. John King, married Katherine Osborne, born 1684, died 1752. A John King of the Southold family, 4th generation (1702-1740) married 1727 Ann, daughter of John Edwards of East Hampton. A Joseph King died at E.H. 1732; he had married Mary, daughter of Judge Thomas Chatfield, she b. 1707; no ch. She m. 2nd Francis Pelletreau who d. in London 1737; and m. 3d. Judge Hugh Gelston in 1738.

By the time of the Revolution there were three Kings who signed the Articles of Association in East Hampton. That was on May 5, 1775.

These were Richard, John, and Daniel.

On June 26, 1776, Richard King with his wife and one son was living in East Hampton. He was ancestor of Selden Leroy King of East Hampton whose wife has done a great deal of research on that family over a period of years. Mrs. King, Dr. Frederick A. Finch, and Mrs. Floyd

Lester whose grandfather was Abraham Miller King, have given the benefit of all their work, which has been put together with the writer's own material and the library's and with information sent in by members of the family. The following will not include every one of the King family even in East Hampton Township; but it is a beginning and represents the only printed genealogy of the East Hampton family by that name.

The first ancestor in America of the present-day East Hampton Kings was William King or Kinge, born in the south of England about 1595, who came to Salem, Mass. in 1635 with his wife Dorothy and several children; he died intestate 1650/1; his widow and several children moved to Southold, L.I.

JOSEPH 5 (s. of David 4, William 3) b. 1730 d. 1818, a house carpenter; in winter of 1740-41, he assisted in driving a herd of cattle across the ice from East Hampton to Gardiner's Island. He m. Hannah, dau. Zebulon and Abigail Conklin King, of Southold, 1753; had ch.

SGT. JEREMIAH 5* (of Orient, L.I.) b. 1737 d. 1819 m. 1763 Deborah, dau. Nathaniel and Elizabeth Evres Dominy of E.H. Ch. Elisha 6, Capt. Frederick 6 b. 1771 d. June 16, 1824.

*Jeremiah is not a common name in the King family. A Jeremiah King m. in Feb. 1798 in Sag Harbor Polly Sanford. A Jeremiah King m. Jane Burns and had dau. Mehitable b. 1812 d. 1888 who m. George W. Miller of Springs. A Jeremiah King of Springs married Temperance -

*Dr. Finch says that Richard 6 came to Three Mile Harbor, E.H. and served as a soldier in the Revolution. He finds more children for Richard than Mrs. King found in the 1800 Census, in the Rufus King papers in the N.Y. Genealogical and Biographical Record, Church and Bible records, and tombstones.

a small boy's penknife.

*The parentage and history of Temperance Penny King have taken more time and trouble, probably, than any other one person in these genealogies, and are still in doubt. Her story as it has come down is an Enoch Arden one probably not

at all unusual in days of deep-sea whaling and poor communications. She married at sixteen John Penny, a whaleman; an item in the Sag Harbor Corrector for July 19, 1828, found by Mrs. S. Leroy King, says: "Md. at Amagansett—Mr. John Penny and Miss Temperance Miller."

King, Miller and Bennett relatives have argued endlessly whether "Aunt Tempy" was a Bennett or a Miller. She was closely related to both. Records show everybody else, but not the parentage of Temperance. Her birth date is recorded in the old King Bible along with that of her second husband—she was born March 23, 1812 and died May 17, 1891. The only thing that seems at all conclusive is the Sag Harbor newspaper item, in the E.H. Free Library. Mrs. S. Leroy King will give her beliefs, as set down from talks with older people in the family; and the writer will preserve other notes, both may be found in the Long Island Historical Collection for future genealogists to mull over.

Shortly after their marriage, John Penny went to sea; he came home long enough to increase his family by a baby daughter, and went off again. This time, he was not heard from for nearly two years and was presumed lost. Finally Temperance married, (or was about to marry,) Benjamin Hubbard King, then an overseer on Gardiner's Island. One night there was a dance at the home of George Miller at Fresh Pond; everybody came from miles around. Late at night a man opened the door and stood outside the circle of light watching the dancers. He said to a man standing by: "I see my wife, but I don't think she knows me. If I can get the fiddlers to play a certain song, I think she will." There was an old sea chantey familiar at that time which ran: "Seven long years make an alteration." ("Aunt Adeline" Bennett Mulligan who died aged 99, March 18, 1950, knew the song well and used to sing it; there was one line that went: "Maybe he be sick or drowned.") The newcomer in a fine strong voice joined in with the fiddles. Tempy almost fainted. "I know that voice! That's John Penny!" So there was a great celebration in which everybody was happy but Tempy's new husband, or her intended, whichever it was.

Just a few months later, on April 19, 1834, John Penny—then 26—with Collins P. Miller, 25, Jonathan Allen Miller, 19, and Daniel Stillman who had married Hannah, daughter of Jonathan and Betsey Miller—were all coming home from Sag Harbor where they had gone to buy supplies. Young John's Uncle Joshua Penny of Three Mile Harbor (the War of 1812 hero) looked out over Gardiner's Bay. It was high noon, warm and calm. He called: "Tempy, you can get the dinner on. John's coming!" Then the next time he looked, the sailboat was gone.

Mrs. S. Leroy King says that "Aunt Nancy" (Mrs. Nathaniel J. Miller who d. 1937) and her father-in-law Remington King who died 1929—both children of Benjamin Hubbard and Temperance King—told her that their mother lost her husband, brother, and cousin all at once, that day. Mrs. Henry Cullum, 93, and Mrs. Sara Recktenwald, maintain that Temperance was a Bennett, half-sister to the latter's grandfather, William Jackson Bennett. She may have been, instead, his sister-in-law, for he married Phebe, daughter of Jonathan and Betsey Miller; Phebe's sister Lucy was wife of Collins P. Miller, Phebe's brother lost on Gardiner's Bay that day was young Jonathan Allen Miller; and Daniel Stillman was husband of Hannah, another sister of Phebe Miller Bennett's. However that may be, those deep-sea whalers' wives went through a great deal.

Dr. King was buried in Oakland Cemetery, Sag Harbor.
